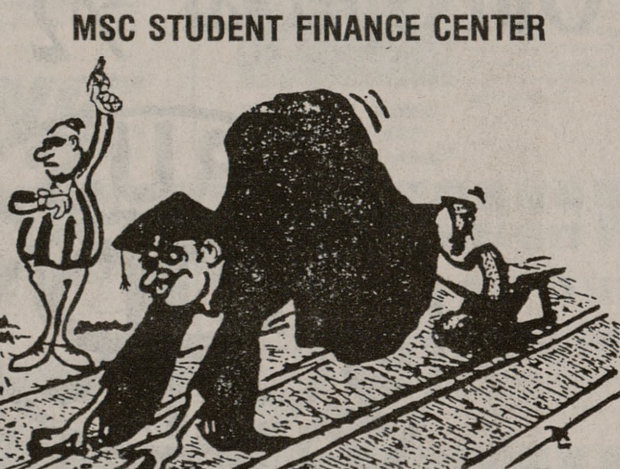

# Families 'seek justice' in look into sons' death

**United Press International SAN DIEGO** — Families from California and Texas, dissatisfied with Marine Corps investigations into their sons' deaths, have contacted each other and their congressmen to seek congressional hearings.

Lance Cpl. Richard L. Kash, 18, was shot while on patrol of a top-secret sector of the U.S. Atlantic Fleet's Naval Weapons Station in Goose Creek, S.C. Pvt. Randall Christian, 18, drowned during a water survival test at the Marine Corps Recruit Depot in San Diego. He was a former lifeguard.

Their fathers, Michael Kash of Pear Blossom, Calif., and Artie Christian of Dallas have agreed to work together and with other families to "seek justice" in their sons' deaths.

Christian, an investigator with the district attorney's office in Dallas, said his and Kash's cases are similar because of "the lies that they (the military) tell you and expect you to believe." He has contacted Texas congressman Jim Mattox, who also is unwilling to accept the Marine Corps' investigation in the Christian case.

"It's pretty obvious that the investigation by the Marine Corps leaves in doubt the competence of the Marine Corps to police itself," Mattox said. "The matter should not be left where it is."

Mattox said a number of injuries and deaths in the Marine

Corps have led to investigations with questionable results.

"If they (the Marines) exonerated themselves in the other events the same way they exonerated themselves in this situation, then I question all the investigations," the congressman said by telephone from Washington office.

The Christian case has been taken up by the House Armed Services Committee.

Unlike the Christian case which concluded with a Marine Corps hearing that ruled no one at the MCRD pool was responsible for the death of the Dallas recruit, the Kash case has led to general court-martial. Lance Cpl. Jeremy L. Clark, 23, of Houston goes on trial next month for involuntary manslaughter.

Michael Kash is not willing to accept the charge in the case. "The only thing I know is that a boy put a clip in an M16 rifle, he pulled a bolt back and locked the round in the chamber; and he took that weapon through three positions from safe to semi-automatic to automatic fire," Kash said. "He aimed the rifle and he pulled the trigger."

And Kash is bitter. "We were proud that (Richard) wanted to do it (join the Marines) so bad, and we were proud to have him (sign up)," Kash said.

"But now, I wish to Christ I had never signed the papers."

# More leg surgery for Hearne boy

**United Press International HOUSTON** — For the third time in eight days, surgeons have been forced to operate on 11-year-old Kirk Sapp of Hearne.

In his latest surgery Friday,

doctors removed more of the fifth-grader's left foot so he can better walk with an artificial part.

A hospital spokesman gave no other details of the surgery. "The doctor says he is steadily improving and will soon be moved to a private room from the intensive care unit," Susan Fox said.

Sapp, who was run over by a train Jan. 6, had his right leg reattached at the hip later that day after being flown to Houston. But last Tuesday doctors at Hermann Hospital determined the leg had become infected and amputated it.

Sapp also lost his left foot in the accident, which happened as he was walking home.
