## Backers caught in 'Squeeze Play'

DALLAS — An attorney for a Baptist church deacon accused of defrauding 20 investors out of \$70,000 for a movie starring Dallas Cowboys says the plaintiffs gambled and lost on "Squeeze Play."

Attorney John Tatum argued Tuesday there was no guarantee William G. Chaffin would pay the money back, and he said the warned investors the investments would pay off only if the movie made money.

Chaffin is on trial in state district court on charges he violated the State Securities Act, allegedly defrauding the investors by persuading them to invest in the movie, which quickly bombed. Investors charge Chaffin reneged on a promise to repay the money within 30 days and that he never put the money into a 1979 film.

The movie — starring Dallas Cowboys Drew Pearson, Ed "The Bull" Jones, Jay Saldi and former player Thomas "Hollywood" Henderson — played for only a week in Dallas. Its longest run was three weeks in Tyler, at the Rose Festival. It also played in Wichita Falls and Fort Worth.

The film told the story of five Vietnam veterans who returned from war and go to college, working part time collecting bills and fighting people who don't want to pay them.

In the movie, Saldi falls in love with his psychology professor who is engaged to marry a U.S. senator. She tells him she's interested.

The Cowboys get jailed. She gets kidnapped in Mexico. Saldi saves her, and they ride off into the sunset on the back of a pickup. The other veterans decide to join a pro football team.

"It's sort of what you call a B film," said Dallas attorney Lockman, one of four investors to testify Tuesday. He gave the movie a "D" grade.

"I really didn't know that much about movies," Lockman said. "You know, what you hear is that they make all kinds of money but thought this was the kind of thing that would appeal to the masses because of the Cowboys."

Barbara Law, who sang with Chaffin in the church choir, she had no money when Chaffin told her about the movie.

"But my father sold a little cabin in my name, and I took \$10,000 of that money to give it to (Chaffin) for investment," she said.

Assistant District Attorney Richard Zadina charged Chaffin with defrauding investors. Hot Windy Day Film Partners had filed for bankruptcy. State law requires a person selling securities disclose all relevant information about the offer.

## Sheriffs to electrify suspects

GALVESTON — The Galveston County Sheriff's office purchased 11 non-lethal electrical shock guns to incapacitate criminals for a few minutes.

Sheriff Joe Max Taylor demonstrated the Taser gun Tuesday, using Undersheriff Clay Wiley as a guinea pig.

"I never did lose consciousness," Wiley said. "I just felt a heck of a jolt of electricity, muscle in my leg just contracted."

Wiley hit the floor immediately after he was shocked by the gun. However, Wiley said he was not injured by the jolt. He received small puncture wounds on his back and leg, said he was "a little wobbly."

The gun, which looks like a flashlight with antennae, shoots out 50,000 volts of low amperage electricity. It has a range of 15 feet, but is most effective from 8 to 12 feet, said Wiley, a Taser salesman.
