Reagan seeks increase in taxes

WASHINGTON—President Reagan has decided to seek temporary increases in federal excise taxes on gasoline, cigarettes, alcoholic beverages other than beer and some luxury items, administration officials said today.
Reagan made the decision reluctantly after a meeting with economic advisers Wednesday to wrap up his 1983 budget except for some "fine tuning," officials said.
The president was urged by his advisers to approve the tax hikes to boost revenues and hold the projected 1983 deficit to \$80 billion, officials said.
Some of the proposals will be unveiled in the State of the Union address Reagan delivers Tuesday to a joint session of Congress. Others will appear in the fiscal 1983 budget he sends to Congress Feb. 8.
Officials have said the selective tax increases sought by the president will be accompanied by a sweeping proposal to transfer numerous welfare, education and transportation programs to state and local governments to administer.
A portion of the higher excise taxes would be returned to the states to help finance their broader responsibilities under Reagan's "New Federalism" program.
Reagan also will propose a federal takeover of the entire Medicaid program to relieve the states of some program costs, officials said.
The president apparently alluding to his forthcoming proposal Wednesday during a first ceremony marking his first anniversary in office.

"Through our program block grants we have returned much of the decision-making state and local governments," said. "But again, it is enough. We're going to re-examine resources as well as responsibilities to the levels of government closest to the people."
"If we do nothing else in administration, we're going to convince this city that the power the money and the responsibility of this country begins and ends with the people and not in some puzzle palace here on Potomac."
Some of the president's usual allies, who share his supply-side economic views, urged him not to boost the "taxes" on such items as alcohol and tobacco on grounds low income Americans will be hardest hit. It was understood that is why Reagan decided to raise taxes on beer.
Officials indicated the luxury items targeted for higher excise taxes would include such items as furs, jewelry and yachts, gives him a Reagan R-N-M.
Reagan in office budget director David Stockman recently that excise tax increases would hurt the little received unsold report cards corporate welfare tax biggest critics.

The government currently adds 17 cents to the cost of gallon of wine and \$10.50 gallon of liquor. The tax cigarettes is 8 cents a pack regulars and 17 cents a pack king size and the levy on gasoline is 4 cents a gallon.
Alcohol taxes alone provide 1.1 percent of the government income.

Khashoggi, 48, amassed fortune selling arms and expanded into banking and other businesses around the world.


Columbia to orbit again

WASHINGTON — The space agency made it official it will try to launch the shuttle Columbia on its third flight on March 22.
Astronauts Jack Lousma, 41-year-old veteran of the Skylab space station, and space newcomer Charles Fullerton, 45, are scheduled to fly the threeable spaceship around the world seven days.
The mission is designed to keep the Columbia in orbit for days longer than it has ever before. The November flight was to have lasted five days but was cut by three days when a fuel cell generator failed.
Air Force Maj. Gen. James Abrahamson, associate space agency administrator in charge of shuttle development, established the formal launch Wednesday after reviewing the status of flight preparations with project officials. Engineers have been working toward the March 22 target for several weeks.
The final test flight is scheduled for July. The ship is make its first operational flight carrying two communication satellites, next November.
