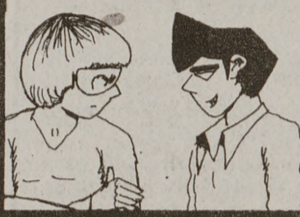

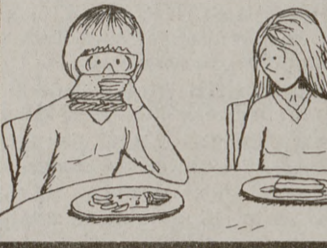

## 60 missiles part of plan

# New MX sites considered

United Press International DALLAS — The Reagan administration is considering a new plan for the placement of MX missiles at existing military facilities in the Southwest, according to a newspaper report.

The proposal would not alter the president's plan to put 40 missiles in existing Minuteman silos, but is one of three options the Air Force is considering for the deployment of 60 additional

MX missiles Reagan has ordered.

The new option proposes shuffling 10 to 30 of the MX missiles among underground concrete silos at several bases, the Dallas Times Herald reported Sunday.

Among other key members of Congress, John Tower, (R)-Texas, has urged the Air Force to develop alternative plans to Reagan's, fearing the stationary

However, officials for the State and Justice departments made clear to a Senate committee that the total quotas for the rest of the world will remain unchanged at a total of 230,000 immigrants per year.

The officials also said the fiscal year 1982 limit for refugee admissions was established at 140,000 — down from the 217,000 limit in fiscal 1981 and a maximum of 231,700 refugees during fiscal year 1980.

Assistant Secretary of State Diego Asencio told the Senate immigration and refugee policy subcommittee the administration's proposal to establish separate limitations of 40,000 each on immigration from Canada and Mexico.

The current immigration ceiling is 270,000 per year — including 20,000 each from Canada and Mexico. With the doubling of the Mexican and Canadian quotas, the total ceiling would rise to 310,000, Asencio said.

Alan Nelson, deputy commissioner of the Justice Department's Immigration and Naturalization Service, said this addition of 40,000 would add significantly to the 550,000 immigrants and refugees expected to enter the United States during fiscal year 1982.

He said the proposal "takes into account the very special and unique ties — social, economic and cultural — which exist between the United States and its two contiguous neighbors."

He said the increases for Canada and particularly Mexico "reflect our close relationship with both while providing an additional opportunity to reduce or deter illegal immigration by opening a supplementary channel for legal immigration to the United States."


