



Lady Longhorns win title; Aggies lose to UH, SMU

The Lady Longhorns of Texas, winners of last year's Southwest Conference women's basketball tournament, repeated the feat Saturday night with a 68-53 victory over Arkansas in G. Rollie White Coliseum.

Meanwhile, the Aggie Ladies, who were knocked from winner's bracket competition Thursday when they lost to Houston 73-36, dropped a consolation game to SMU Friday afternoon 76-53.

In the final game, Texas

surged to a 14-point halftime lead, mainly on the outside shooting of all-tournament forward Sherryl Hauglum, who had 18 points for the night.

The Longhorns had no trouble maintaining their lead, shooting 48 percent from the field and 64 percent from the free throw line as they ran away with the 15-point victory. Annette Smith and Terri Mackey, who added 15 and 10 points, respectively, to the Longhorns' effort were also named to the all-tournament teams.

Another all-tourney selec-

tion, Bettye Fiscus, was the lone Razorback in double figures with 14 points.

In Friday's consolation semifinal, the Mustangs jumped to a 35-23 halftime lead, extending the margin to 32 points midway through the second half. Texas A&M managed to chip away some of that lead after Kelley Sullivan, who had hobbled off the court with an injured ankle with 19:31 left in the game, returned to score six of her 20 points.

The Aggie comeback fell short, however, and SMU hung on to its lead for the victory. All-

tournament forward Rompola finished with 25 for SMU, the game high.

McClennan, which replaced Hardin-Simmons University as the Aggies' first opponent of the spring, played better than Hardin-Simmons would have, tennis Coach David Kent said.

"The first match (of the year) is always tough," he said. The Aggies won eight of the nine matches they played and Kent said the high quality of tennis is what he was expecting from his team.

In the number one singles match, freshman Mike

Pazourek posted the most impressive win by beating Don Woods, 6-2, 6-7, 6-1.

"Mike's just a freshman, but he's many years ahead of that," Kent said. "He's outstanding."

Junior team captain Ron Kowal beat Mario Rauch, 6-0, 6-2.

"I'm happy with Kowal, who played so well in the wind. That usually bothers him," Kent said.

The Aggies won singles matches with junior Brian Joelson defeating Ronen Graziani, 6-3, 6-3, and freshman Greg Hill beating Richard Tatum, 6-0, 6-1.

Sophomore Van Barry rallied to beat Tom Adams, 6-4, 4-6, 6-4.

"Van hung in there and played very well once he got going," Kent said.

Tom Judson, a junior, fered the only defeat for A&M, losing to Ed Strickland, 2-6, 6-3.
