

If that is true, the Chaffee County sheriff's office in central Colorado would like to talk to Bobby Lee Wood of Abilene. The sheriff's office spent a lot of time and money trying to find Wood.

Wood led a group of ROTC students from Hardin Simmons University on a snowshoe expedition into the mountains west of Buena Vista in December. After helping the group set up camp, Wood left without telling anyone.

Two helicopters and numerous ground units searched for Wood for a week, but finally gave up the effort Dec. 11.




