Battalion Staff New Head Coach and Athletic Director Jackie Sherrill is a competitor and a man who knows how to win, his associate athletic director told the Class of '83 Thursday night. Charles Thornton told an au-

dience of about 40 people that Sherrill has assembled a staff that can get the job done, not only in football, but in each of the sports Texas A&M University competes in.

"Our goal is to have an overall sports program that is a good as any in the country," Thornton said. He said the process of building Texas A&M's nationwide reputation has already begun.

"We're going to build an all-purpose basketball arena in the near future. We have a commitment from the Board of Regents for a feasibility study, which I would expect to take six to nine months. The earliest we could have it completed would be two years." Thornton said. The are-
