



## Police brutality case results in plea bargain

**BROWNSVILLE** — A former McAllen policeman has become the second ex-officer to reach a plea-bargaining agreement with the government in the prisoner brutality cases involving the force's so-called "C-Shift Animals."

Isidro Ybanez Jr., 35, who had revealed details of brutality incidents to federal authorities, pleaded guilty Wednesday to federal civil rights charges.

"I'm pleading guilty because I do understand I violated the man's rights," Ybanez told U.S. Magistrate William Mallet. "It had been a long, hard night and I lost my temper and I used more force than I should have."

Sentencing was scheduled for March 5. Prosecutors recommended Ybanez, who admitted beating an intoxicated prisoner

in 1977, receive a 30-day suspended jail term, be placed on five years probation and be forbidden to seek employment in law enforcement during that period.

The guilty plea by the divorced father of four who manages a McAllen sporting goods store came nine days after a similar plea-bargaining agreement between the government and former Sgt. Roberto Ramos, whose trial on the charges had ended with a jury deadlocked 10-2 for conviction.

Three other ex-officers also were indicted, and jury selection began in their combined cases in U.S. magistrate's court Wednesday. Scheduled for trial next Monday are Tom W. Carter, Jaime E. Contreras and Alfredo Saldana.

The misdemeanor charges

carried a maximum penalty of one year in prison and a fine.

The American Civil Liberties Union filed suit against McAllen Police Department in 1976, charging widespread police brutality. Hours of videotape recorded at the McAllen police station — including a videotape showing officers punching and kicking prisoners — had been installed to protect officers against false charges of brutality.

An eight-month investigation by the FBI and a federal grand jury followed the ACLU suit, which resulted in \$410,000 in settlements and jury awards to 25 plaintiffs, and the indictment of 11 officers in November.

## Male rape complaints increasing in Houston

**HOUSTON** — With attitudes toward homosexuality changing, police say they are getting more male complaints about homosexual rape—a crime they say always has occurred, but usually went unreported.

"Several years ago, it was unheard of," Detective L.W. Henning said. "They didn't want to sit in front of a judge and tell what happened. It's a matter of macho image. But they are coming out more. It's a freer lifestyle."

Henning said police now average about 10 homosexual rape complaints from men annually. He said the total is tiny compared to the 1,000 or so heterosexual rapes reported by women.

But he said five years ago there were no male rape reports. So far, Detective Donna Autry said, she knows of no female homosexual rape complaints.

Technically, police call male-against-male sex attacks "sexual abuse" because Texas law defines rape as applying only to man-against-woman situations, but officers say it is involuntary sexual intercourse, so the term rape fits.

Last fall, police received four male rape complaints within a month's time. One case involved a 23-year-old mentally retarded man who reported being forced into sex acts and then raped by a man who had "befriended" him.

Henning said most of the cases reported involve victims who are openly homosexual or bisexual, but he said police had one recent case involving a heterosexual man who complained he had been abducted and raped by another man.

The suspect was not convicted.

Henning said convictions are rare because many of the complaints arise from disputes between male lovers, but he said police have put some offenders behind bars.

Detective Autry said she

handled two male rape complaints during 1981 in which the suspects were convicted and served prison terms.

One man who accused homosexual at gunpoint on a bus stop and robbed and raped him received 12 years in prison.

Another man in his 30s emerged from a vacuum cleaner and used a hammer to assault a 17-year-old boy to whom he received five years in prison.

Detective Autry said the youth escaped after he initially undressed and assaulted put the hammer on the victim brought police to the scene to make the arrest.

Homicide Detective Brian Lohry said homosexual rape in general is increasing in Houston, mainly because what he called a big "transients" into the area.

**LARKSPUR, Calif.** — When the Taiwan girl's athletic exchange team began dancing instead of dribbling, Redwood High School officials thought there was something wrong.

The 13 youngsters were greeted at the airport and taken to the high school gym to throw a few hoops in preparation for a girl's basketball team match.

Taiwan's students turned out to be an entertainment troupe instead of a sports squad.

"They're not athletes," school Principal Jim Hanretty said Wednesday. "But they can sing and dance."

Hanretty said after seeing the girls perform, the exchange error no longer mattered.

"They're sensational," Hanretty said. "They even did a great rendition of 'Oh Suzannah.'"

He said Redwood High and Ining High School have had a longstanding "sister school" relationship that has focused since 1978 on athletic exchanges.

## Testimony about slurs banned in Atlanta trial

**ATLANTA** — A judge Thursday struck down the prosecution's attempts to show Wayne Williams was bent on killing black homosexuals, ruling that testimony saying Williams made racial slurs would prejudice the jury.

Denise Martin testified out of the presence of the jury Wednesday that Williams "used to call members of his own race 'niggers.'"

But Judge Clarence Cooper,

at the outset of today's trial upheld a defense objection to her testimony would prejudice the jury of eight blacks and whites. Williams, a 23-year-old black freelance photographer and aspiring music producer on trial for the murder of Nathaniel Cater and Jimmy Payne, two of the 28 blacks — all but two of whom were abducted and murdered in Atlanta. Testimony tied him to 11 more of the slayings.
