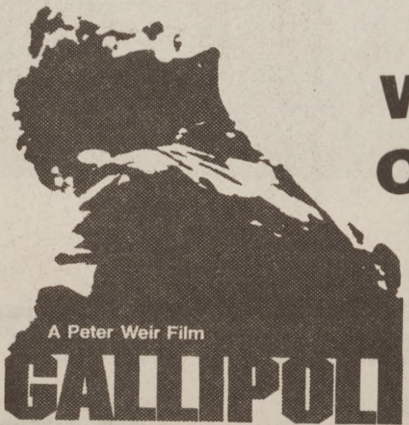

United Press International DALLAS — A telephone tipped officers to the home of a 71-year-old man and his wheelchair-bound wife, whose bodies were found in their ransacked apartment, authorities said.

A telephone caller who "believed a murder had occurred" led investigators to the bodies of Arthur W. Knappertz and his wife, Valerie, 68, an investigator said.

The Dallas County Medical Examiner's office has ruled that Knappertz died of a blow to the head, although he also had been stabbed in the chest. Mrs. Knappertz, a diabetic who had both legs amputated, was stabbed in the chest.

Cambodian

CARROLLTON — A Cambodian man who police believe shot and killed his wife then killed himself apparently tried to protect his 5-year-old daughter

by forcing her to sleep in the family van, officials said.

Carrollton police investigator Donny Watts said Har Hey, about 27, apparently took the child out to the van and ordered her to go to sleep before killing his wife, Teng Meng Hey, about 25, and himself in an apparent homicide-suicide.

Both had been shot once in the head with a .22-caliber revolver near Hey's body in the couple's apartment bedroom.

ODESSA — Officials were searching for suspects in a shooting which left killed a 37-year-old Odessa man and wounded his wife.

Sheriff's department spokesmen say they have no motive in the shooting of Henry Clay Carroll and his wife Barbara, 39.

Carroll was killed by a single gunshot wound to the head and his wife was listed in stable con-

dition with a gunshot wound in the stomach following the Tuesday morning shooting.

Arson

HOUSTON — Investigators suspect arson in a fire that swept through a southeastside motel-apartment.

The blaze damaged 11 units and forced 30 people from their homes.

Tax return

AUSTIN (UPI) — State Comptroller Bob Bullock reported his office was returning more than \$10 million to Texas cities and counties as their share of tax on mixed drinks.

Bullock said Texans spent more than \$1.25 billion for mixed drinks during 1981, and paid about \$125 million in state and local taxes on the drinks.

The state's share of the revenue totals \$88.7 million, while cities and counties received \$36.3 million.

Scout to get medal for saving family

United Press International TEXAS CITY — A Cub Scout who saved his family from their burning home will be cited for his bravery by the Boy Scouts of America.

Ronald G. Lazenby, 7, will be honored Friday at the Heights Elementary School in Texas City with one of the rarest awards presented by BSA, the Honor Medal for Lifesaving.

Officials said Lazenby, third grader, awoke last June 14 about 2 a.m., and found his bedroom engulfed in flames.

They said he worked his way past flames, moved through the

smoke-filled hallway and climbed upstairs to wake his parents, Ronald and Katara Lazenby.

They quickly grabbed the two other small children, all five climbed through a window onto the garage roof and jumped safely to the ground.

Another daughter escaped through a separate window.

The medal is awarded by Boy Scouts National Review Board to registered members "who demonstrate unusual heroism in saving or attempting to save a life at the risk of their own."

RHA to lock in on safety project
