'To that antibody, we ched a form of the plant toxcin. The antibody killed only cancer cells and not the norstem cells in bone marrow. "We know that we killed 99.9 cent of the tumor cells be-The discus oped tumors several months searchers said.

Vitetta worked with Drs. Jonahton Uhr and Keith Krolic. The three reported on the procedure in the scientific journal Nature, released Thursday.

in the use of bone marrow transplants in cancer patients, Vitetta cars that slipped off the track ing sulfuric acid after they desaid. "It could prove to be a large improvement in the existing

techniques," she said.

The risk in bone marrow transplants has been the inability to detect all cancer cells in a patient. Cancer cells left in the patient after the transplant can begin mulitiplying, spreading the leukemia again.

But Vitetta said the ricin compound developed at Southwestern could be an effective treatment for attacking the undetected cancer cells.


