Four die in two-home fire

United Press International SAN ANTONIO — Four elderly residents of a 90-year-old home in the city's historical King William area died late Wednesday in a quickspreading fire that destroyed the two-story

house and an adjacent one. Three other residents escaped the fire, which apparently began on the ground floor, officials said. Fire officials Thursday positively identified one of the vic-

tims as Sandy Morales, 61. The other three victims were tentatively identified as Billie Baly, 45; Raymond Casanova, 65; and Woodrow Gonzalez, 62. Two other people were believed to be missing after the fire was put out, but Lopez said a thorough search of the debris had uncovered no additional victims.

"The woman who owned the building was very distraught and thought there might have been a couple of more people living there," he said. "But we searched through the rubble and didn't find anyone. We think now she may have been confused and thinking of the three who escaped the fire."

Lopez said a visitor drove up to the house when the fire began and saw an explosion.

"I believe the explosion was from accumulated smoke in the house," Lopez said. Lopez said the cause for the fire had not been determined.

"I was just resting in the chair when I heard so much noise I didn't know what was going on," Erwin Schulde, 73, one of three surviving residents, said. "The landlady came and knocked on my door and told me the home was on fire, so I left."

Other witnesses said flames completely engulfed the white

and green house.

Damages to both houses were estimated at about \$200,000. It took two and a half hours for more than 100 firefighters with about two dozen units of equipment to extinguish the blaze. One fireman received minor medical treatment for a knee injury.

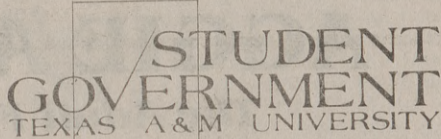
Lopez said the rent-subsidized home caught fire quickly and the flames spread to the adjacent two-story wood home. An elderly couple in the adjacent home escaped when a neighbor ran to the door and told them the fire had broken out.

A woman living across the street in the renovated historical neighborhood just south of downtown said she saw flames shooting out the first floor windows and onto the front porch.

"I didn't see nobody trying to get out, just big flames coming outside," Maria Rothenbach said. "I heard my dog barking and I went to see and I saw the insides of the room all on fire. The fire started already going to the next house."

A fire department dispatcher said four or five fires had been reported in the King William area in the past year.

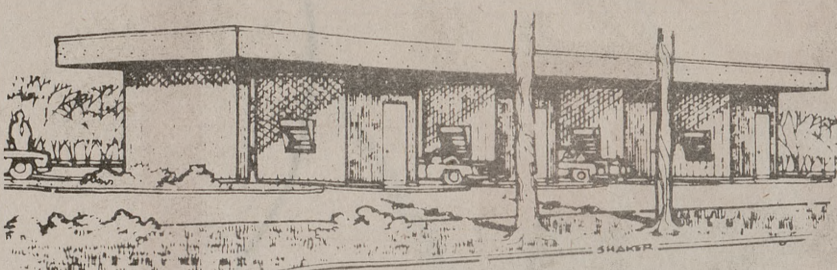

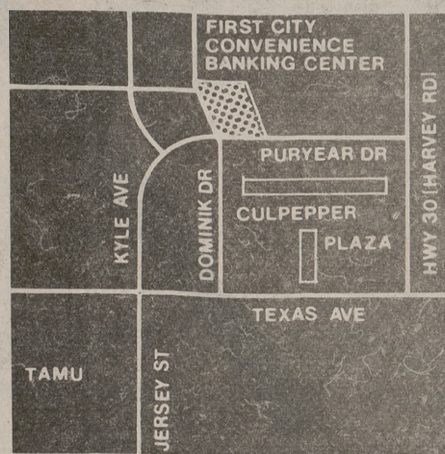
