UT-Dallas names president

DALLAS — Dr. Robert H. Rutford, executive vice chancellor of the University of Nebraska in Lincoln, has been appointed president of the University of Texas at Dallas.

Rutford, 49, was appointed Friday to succeed Dr. Bryce Jordan, UTD's president of 10 years. Jordan was appointed executive vice chancellor for academic affairs with the UT system in September 1981.

Rutford dealt primarily with the expansion of research at the University of Nebraska. Funding from outside sources more than doubled during his tenure, a UTD spokesman said.

Financial system questions effect of new gold coin

WASHINGTON — The Gold Commission thinks it's a good idea to mint a new gold coin featuring an American Eagle, but there are many questions to be answered on how it would affect the U.S. financial system before it can fly.

The government panel Friday recommended, in place of a return to the gold standard abandoned in the 1930s, a coin that would be worth its weight in gold at the going rate, plus a small minting fee. The coin would have no face value.

A Treasury Department staff

study of various gold coin proposals raised questions sure to be repeated again and again if Congress and the White House seriously consider the commission's recommendation.

The coin would be exempt from capital gains and sales taxes, in some ways would bear a legal resemblance to a postage stamp and in others to a government security. It could be used to settle some debts, but would fall far short of being money as the term describes paper bills and coins. The commission specified the coin would not be legal tender.

Chopper rescues stranded three

PAGOSA SPRINGS, Colo. — An Army MAST helicopter Saturday used a sling to rescue three people stranded overnight when their own chopper developed engine problems and made a controlled landing in mountainous terrain.

No one was injured. Paula Pool, Archuleta County sheriff's dispatcher, said the helicopter flew into the Hughes

Ranch area at dawn and lifted them out.

The downed helicopter carried Larry Nelson and Glen Eyre, both employees of the Colorado Division of Wildlife, and Eyre's wife. Rescuers spotted the three from the air Friday after Nelson radioed his position to search planes.

Ground crews on snowmobiles were unable to reach them because of deep snow.

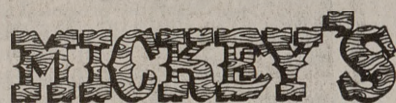
