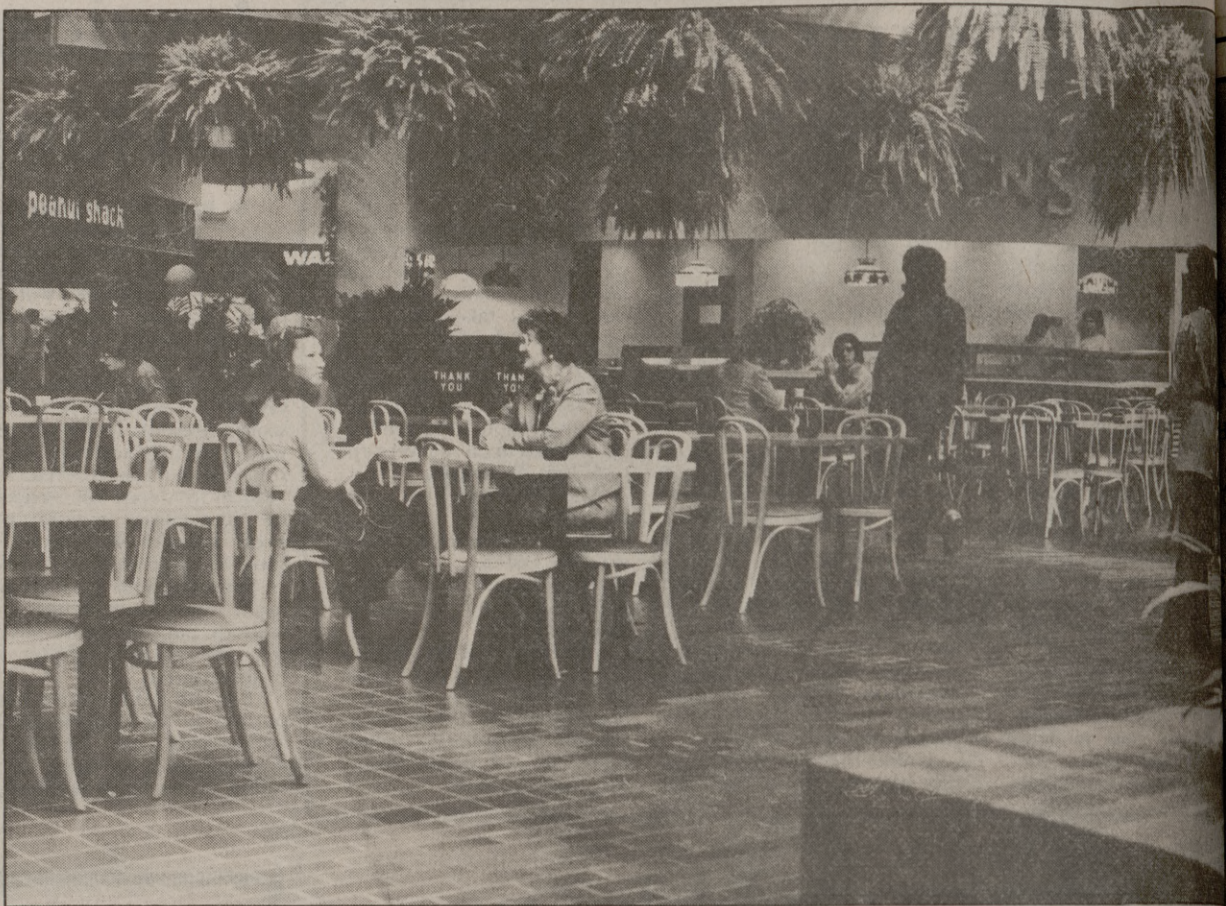


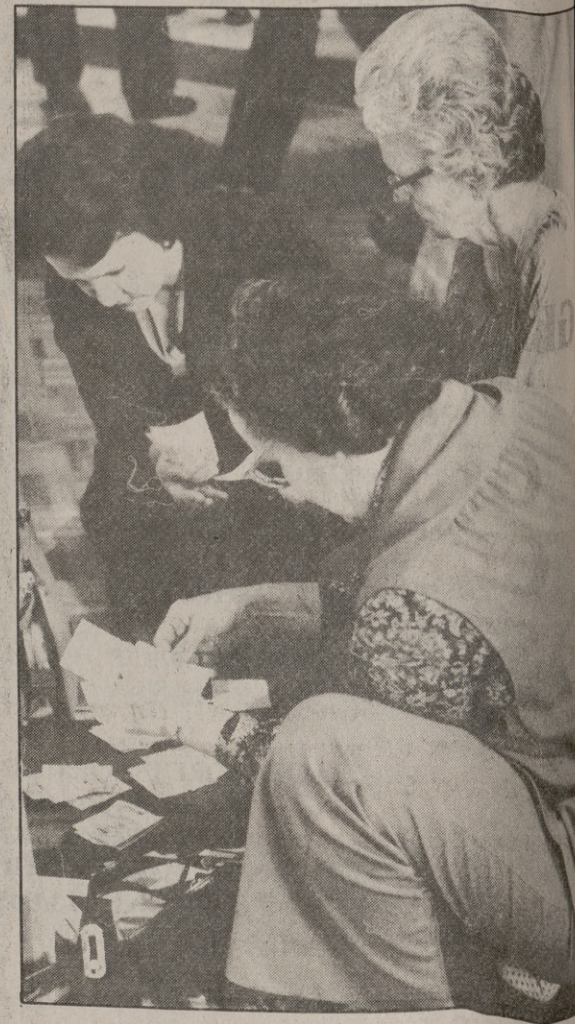
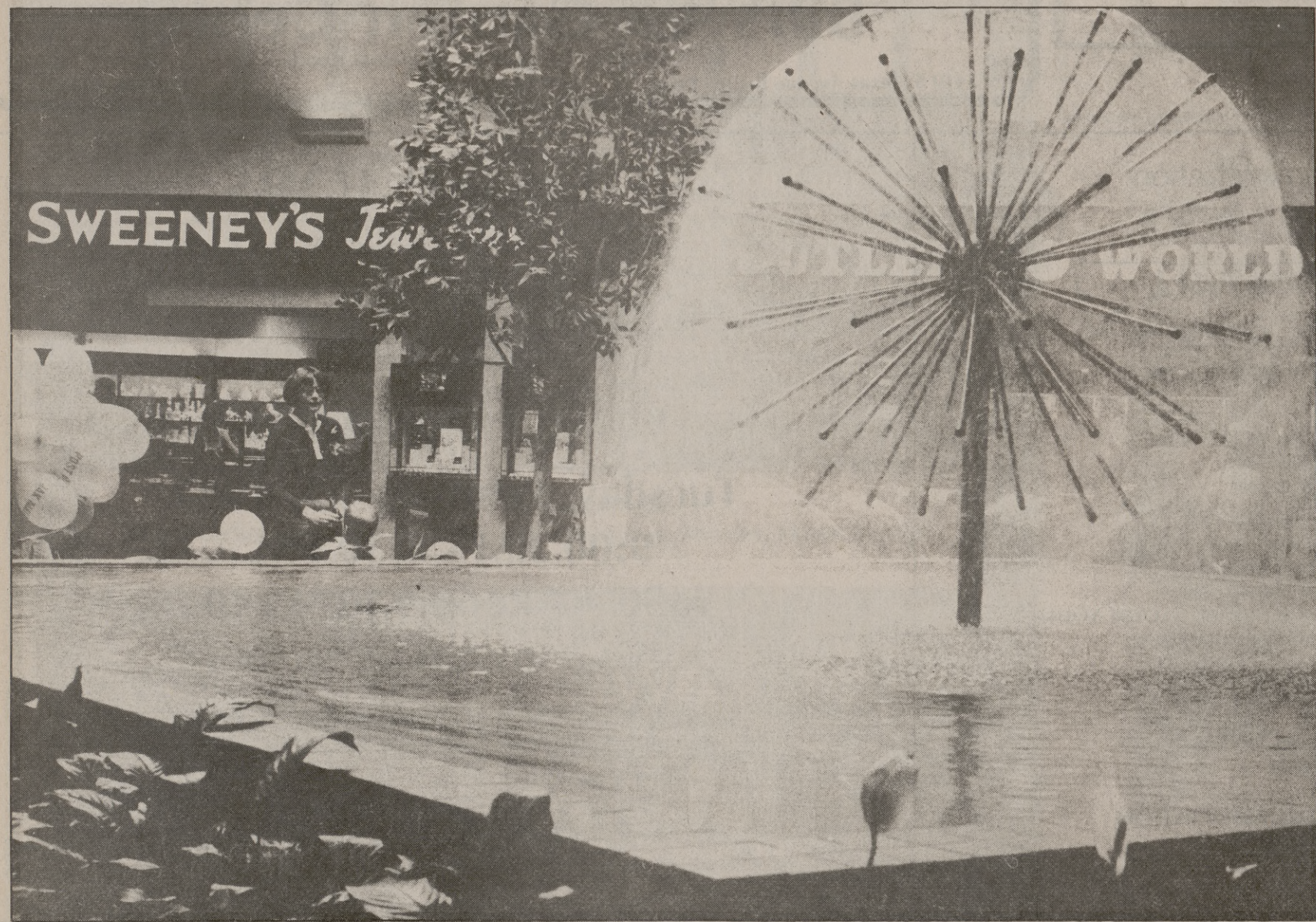
Kids, cookies, coupons part of activities
