Of a possible 400 points, Heye had 368, good Texas Invitational at UT.



The Razorbacks took their second straight indoor championship, running away from the rest of the competition with 128 points. The nearest challenger was Texas with 87.

Thomas' Aggies finished fifth with 45 points. Arkansas collected four first

places, three of those coming in the middle and long distance events. Thomas said the Razorbacks were expected to dominate.

They have so many good distance runners. Until somebody beats them, they'll be the best in the conference," he said.

Sophomore Rod Richardson was the lone first-place finisher for the Aggies. The Shreveport, La. native ran the 60-vard dash in 6.12 seconds, in front of two

the best wide receivers in the the old SWC pole vault record SWC. Phillip Epps of TCU and Herkie Walls of Texas finished 2-3 behind Richardson.

Stanley Floyd of Houston and Bruce Davis were both favorites in the 60-yard dash, but Floyd scratched because of a hamstring injury and Davis pulled up lame during the race.



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
