lives a few blocks from a lead smelter was listed in fair condition Saturday after collapsing

complaining of a headache and

Francine Wells, 10, was hospitalized earlier in the week,

"Her lead level is over twice the limit for children," Dr. James C. Garriott said. "It's imperative that she get treatment and keep from getting exposed to it (lead) in the near future."

with more than 12,000 residents who live near three lead smelters in Dallas, protested possible lead contamination to the City Health Department.

Subsequent tests by city and federal authorities cited little danger to the public.

Garriott said the high amount of lead in Wells' blood could cause brain damage.

Clements introduces plan to control illegal alien flow

United Press International EL PASO — A plan that in-cludes worker identification cards and employer sanctions as a way to control illegal immigration into the United States was proposed by Gov. Bill Clements Friday.

Clements unveiled his proposal Friday after meeting privately for more than three hours with New Mexico Gov. Bruce King and Gov. Roberto de la Madrid of the Mexican state of

Baja California.

The three governors, along with Gov. Alfonso Martinez Dominguez of Neuvo Leon, make up a U.S. Mexican Border Governors Conference subcommittee on immigration.

Clements based his plan on what he called a "three-part package" to document Mexican workers looking for employ-ment north of the border. He suggested that workers receive an exit visa from the Mexican government and, at the same didn't elaborate.
