Mothers try for stricter drunken driving laws

DALLAS — Mothers Against Drunk Drivers — a nationwide group pushing for tougher drunken-driving laws — is bringing its campaign to Texas. The movement is coming on the motivation of an Irving woman who was seriously injured in an automobile accident caused by a drunken driver in which three of her friends were killed. Joyce Clark said MADD would organize pressure on the 1983 Legislature to require a

minimum of a \$500 fine, 30 days in jail and and one-year revocation of driver's licenses for first-time driving while intoxicated offenses.

The organization, which is based in California, has chapters in 60 communities, including Houston, and is forming chapters in Dallas, El Paso, Austin and San Antonio.

MADD lobbied for changes in California, where a 48-hour jail term now is mandatory for a person's first DWI offense and 10 days for the second.

She said the group also would ask the Legislature to impose a 5- or 10-cent tax on mixed drinks to pay for new jails and to give police departments more money to spend on enforcing drunken driving violations.

Clark was seriously injured when a drunken driver hit the van driven by her friend Sam Kendrick last April near Sherman. Kendrick and two children were killed.

"Every time I take a step I think about him (the drunken driver)," said Clark, who must

walk with a cane. "It's that I'm upset about. His fourth DWI. The other had been reduced to no driving.

"You have to channel anger into something positive."

The organization was founded by Candy Lightner of Sacramento, Calif. Her 13-year-old daughter, Carime, was and killed by a drunken driver in 1980.

Texans against 'remote' radar, say its too close for comfort

CHRISTOVAL — Residents of this tiny Texas town are trying to persuade the Air Force to take its \$100 million, 10-story-high radar installation and stick it somewhere else. They say their area is not remote enough for such an installation.

After inspecting several other proposed sites in Tom Green County, the Air Force announced earlier this year it would place the \$100 million installation atop 2,300-foot Mt. Susan, less than two miles from Christoval. More than 80 residents, headed by a group called "People to Relocate PAVE PAWS," met with Air Force officials last

week and told them they would like a more remote site for the installation.

PAVE PAWS stands for Precision Acquisition Vehicle Entry Phased Array Warning System, the technical name for the radar installation.

"We are hopeful it will be moved to a remote site," Garry Donaldson, a group spokesman, said. "We are not opposed to PAVE PAWS radar or the Air Force. We just feel that 'remote' is very important here, and by moving the radar to a remote site, a lot of our questions will solve themselves."

Donaldson said residents are concerned about the newness of the radar system and the fact that the huge, triangular building will emit a microwave beam

from thousands of tiny antennae on two sides.

The installation, which will be the fourth of its kind to be built in the nation, sends out a microwave beam that scans the horizon for 240 degrees. Its primary mission is to detect submarine launch ballistic missiles, and it will be able to see 3,000 miles into the Gulf and the southern Pacific.

Air Force spokesmen said the microwave radiation that would beam into Christoval is only .01 microwatts per square centimeter, well below the safety level of 1,000 microwatts per square centimeter set by the Environmental Protection Agency.

Residents began composing petitions in January to send to their legislators and to President

Reagan. The Air Force is to a Feb. 1 deadline for additional sites that might be alternatives to Mt. Susan.

Air Force officials told residents at the four-hour meeting last week that the team finished its report, but that the additional sites are considered potentially good. It said a recommendation expected in a couple of weeks.

County Judge Arley said commissioners in Green County are convinced radar will not harm humans, animals and predicted would probably approve site. He said, however, the Force cannot guarantee there would be no possible adverse effects.

Yearlong investigation ends, 15 tons of marijuana seized

HOUSTON — Law enforcement officials seized more than 30,000 pounds of marijuana early Monday on a shrimp boat near Baytown and arrested 18 men, U.S. Customs officials said.

Customs spokesman Charles Conroy said the marijuana, with a street value of about \$19 million, remained on the 65-foot shrimper "Desperation," and none of the men have been charged yet.

The investigation leading up Monday's bust has been underway for about a year, and involved at least 10 city, county, state and federal law enforcement organizations, Conroy

said. Conroy said that at 3:30 a.m., officials watched at a private fishing camp near Baytown as at least two loads of the illegal weed were loaded into waiting trucks to be hauled off. Officers arrested the truck drivers outside the fishing camp area. Conroy said the trucks were loaded with the marijuana.

Officials are not sure where the marijuana came from, but Conroy said he suspected from Colombia.

Conroy said there was no violence at the time of the arrests.

The nationalities of the arrested have not yet been determined, although Conroy there were several Americans, Cubans and other Spanish-speaking men.

Conroy said the charge be violations of state law, although there also may be federal conspiracy charges.

The marijuana was packed in either burlap or plastic, in bales weighing about 100 pounds each.

A late model pickup truck and camper, a small shrimp boat and two U-Haul trucks were seized, Conroy said.
