Assistant police chief acquitted in Tyler case

TYLER — Assistant Police Chief Willie Hardy said he was \$50,000 poorer, a little sadder,

but relieved over his acquittal on charges of setting up defendants in a massive drug probe gone sour.

Jurors deliberated less than three hours Tuesday before finding the one-time East Texas Lawman of the Year innocent on civil rights charges.

"It's been a tough battle but with God on your side you've got to be a winner," Hardy said in a telephone interview.

Hardy's troubles began in 1979, when an eight-month drug investigation that netted 97 arrests was tarnished by allegations the two principal undercover officers — Greig Matthews and Kim Ramsey — were setting up people for prosecution.

Matthews and Ramsey, who have since married, subsequently admitted framing nightclub owner Kenneth Bora and planting drugs on suspects. Matthews said he took drugs himself. Charges against most of the defendants have been dropped.

Last November, Hardy, Tyler's first undercover narcotics agent, was indicted on civil rights charges, claiming he covered up for the two agents.

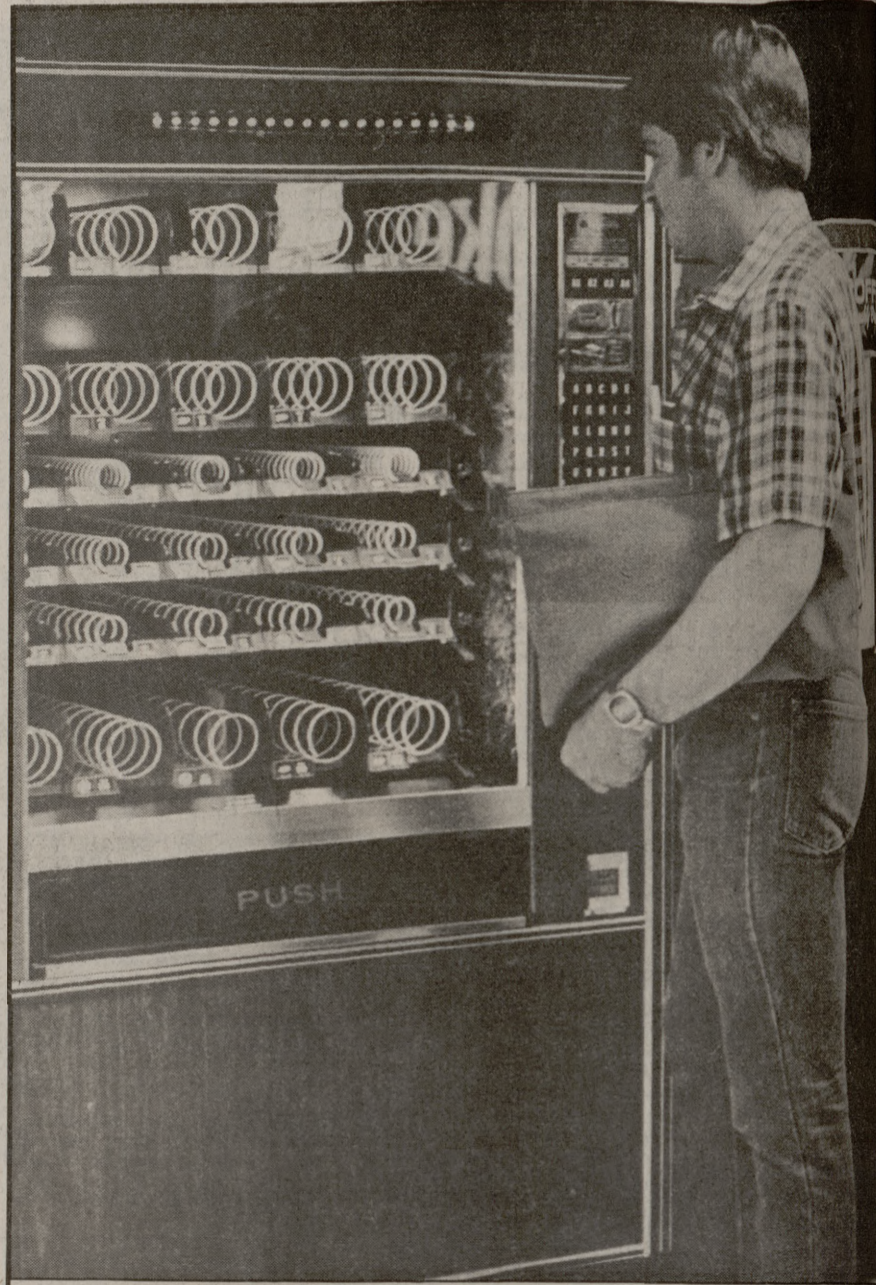
Hardy said he offered to "do anything I could to avoid an indictment," including taking a polygraph examination at his own expense, "but they insisted on going the trial route."

Hardy said defending himself on the charges has cost him \$50,000 in straight cash.

"Then there are things you can't put a dollar amount on: the pressure and the damage to the family, anxiety and emotional stress.

"I have three boys — ages 17, 8, and 7. They took it kind of like you expect children to," he said. "It hurts when a second grader cries himself to sleep or comes home from school crying because someone's told him his daddy's going to prison."

Hardy, who was police chief when he was indicted, said he traded jobs with assistant chief Leo Britton for the duration of the trial. Mayor Robert Nall indicated Tuesday he would press for Hardy's reinstatement as chief.

Families can't sue helicopter firm in Texas, court says

AUSTIN — The Texas Supreme Court, in a 6-3 decision, ruled Wednesday the families of four people killed in an Amazon jungle helicopter crash during a pipeline construction project cannot sue the Colombian heli-

copter firm in a Texas court. The court majority ruled Helicopteros Nacionales de Colombia, South America, also known as Helicol, had no offices in Texas, and the survivors who filed the suit were not residents of Texas. Therefore, the court

ruled, Texas courts had jurisdiction in the case.

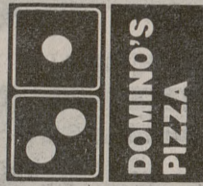
Helicol had been providing helicopter services for pipeline construction projects in Peru in 1974 by a joint venture involving Williams International Sudamericana Ltd. of Oklahoma, Sedco Construction of Texas, and Horn International Inc. of Texas.

A trial court in Houston initially overruled Helicol's challenge to the jurisdiction of Texas courts in the case. The Texas Court of Civil Appeals then ruled that decision Wednesday. Texas courts had jurisdiction.

In a dissenting opinion, Justice James P. Wallace said Helicol had purchased all its helicopter fleet from Bell Helicopter in Fort Worth, Texas, and had employed Texas workers on the project during a two-year period in Texas on a year-round basis, and, therefore, was within the jurisdiction of Texas courts.
