The first mission calls for the laboratory to spend seven days in space, where scientists will conduct experiments in astronomy, solar physics, Earth observations, space plasma physics for peace. It's purpose is sics and life science.

One American and one European scientist will fly on the mission along with the comman-der and pilot of the shuttle and two NASA astronauts called mission specialists.

On the third mission, scientists hope to send four squirrel monkeys and 24 rats into space to determine how the animals for ESA. will live away from gravity

After the four initial flights, American scientists plan a mixed cargo mission where civilian customers can pay for use of Spacelab to conduct their own experiments.

## Fewer girls get pills; afraid clinics will tell

United Press International WASHINGTON — Some

birth control clinics report the number of teenagers visiting them has dropped in recent weeks because girls mistakenly believe the administration's proposed parent notification rule already is in effect.

Various organizations have voiced criticism claiming the proposal will cause more teenage pregnancies and venereal disease.

The Reagan administration formally proposed last month that parents be told within 10 days when girls under 18 receive prescriptions from federally funded clinics, and receipt of the notification be verified. Nationally, 1.5 million girls visit family planning clinics.

The public has 60 days to submit comments, which by law must be taken into account. Even if the rules are approved, a lawsuit will likely be filed to de-

Since word of the proposal leaked out in December, Plan-ned Parenthood clinics in San Francisco saw drops in their teenage clientele, the critics said.
