U.S. Steel merger to get approval of Marathon Oil

FINDLAY, Ohio — Marathon Oil Co. shareholders voted Thursday on a takeover by U.S. Steel Corp., with all signs indicating they approved of the \$6 billion merger.

The ballots were collected by independent auditors who began counting them immediately. Shareholders opposing the merger — seeking more money for their stock — had already conceded they lacked the votes to block it.

A favorable vote by two-thirds of Marathon's shareholders was needed to seal the second-largest merger in U.S. history, but acquiring that margin appeared to be no problem for U.S. Steel.

The largest merger was when DuPont acquired Conoco last year for \$7.8 billion.

The shareholders meeting,

called to order at 10 a.m. by Marathon President Harold Hoopman, quickly turned into a shouting match when Hoopman threatened to turn off a dissident shareholder's microphone.

Hoopman got into an argument with Jim McElroy of HFM Associates, a financial consulting firm that has been advising the dissidents.

"You've got many shareholders who feel they've been sold down the river," McElroy said. "Why did you do this?"

Hoopman began to answer, but was interrupted by McElroy. "Let's be courteous to each other or we'll get rough with each other," Hoopman warned. "I'm a roughneck. I'll shut your microphone off here in a moment."

Several hundred stockholders overflowed the main meeting room. Others were placed in other rooms of Marathon headquarters equipped with closed circuit television sets and microphones.

Earth doesn't stand still for the Jupiter Effect

The planets aligned, but the Earth did not move. Fans of the Jupiter Effect theory will have to wait until 2357 for another chance to see if the rare celestial configuration can destroy the world.

The Jupiter Effect became an astronomical joke Wednesday, much like the Man in the Moon. Other than people who acted like animals at a doomsday party in Miami and a tide that was 0.04 millimeters higher than normal in Brazil, it was business as usual on Earth.

The solar system's nine planets were clustered within 95 degrees Wednesday — an alignment unseen since 1803 — and the authors of "The Jupiter Effect" had claimed the resulting gravitational pull would cause earthquakes, volcanic eruptions and bring cosmic winds from the sun.

Scientists said the gravitational pull was only 4-1,000ths of that produced by the moon and sun, but the planetary arrangement did help police catch drug smugglers in Puerto Rico.

Tens of thousands of Puerto Ricans were out before dawn to scan the sky and in Arecibo, authorities arrested 26 drug traffickers with an assist from the Jupiter Effect.

"A lot of people didn't see us coming because they were looking at the sky," one drug agent said.

It would have taken more than doomsday in Rochester, N.Y., to impress Peter Chaston of the National Weather Service.

"People here are so used to being doomed by all kinds of weather in western New York doomsday would've been redundant," he said.

"I'm not surprised the world hasn't ended. It's also premature to put out a doomsday forecast because we haven't had the next ice age yet. We didn't get the shakes, so we're not going to get the bake."

"No legitimate scientist has seriously supported this stupidity — and that even includes myself."

Four people were stabbed, fistfights broke out and several people had their purses snatched at the Doomsday Dawn beach party in Miami.

"I feel terrible," said Jack Horkheimer, one of the coordinators of the planet-watching party. "It just makes me feel sick. There were people learning about the planets, kids asking questions."

A minor tremor Tuesday in earthquake-prone Peru made some people think the "end" was running ahead of schedule. Twelve hours later another quake hit.

"Any kind of seismic movement cannot be related to the lineup of planets," the president of the Peruvian Astrology Association said.
