Spurs deflate Clippers 106-98

SAN ANTONIO — Spurs guard George Gervin says his team was forced to deflate the confidence of the San Diego Clippers felt going in to Tuesday's game.

In the teams' past two meetings, the Clippers — who have won only 16 games this season — scored decisive victories over San Antonio.

"Basketball is a funny game, so you must strive to be consistent," Gervin said. "They have confidence when they play us and we had to take that away from them tonight."

The Spurs produced a tremendous third-quarter surge to overcome a halftime deficit and beat San Diego, 106-98.

San Diego jumped to a 61-50 halftime lead, but the Clippers

fell apart midway through the third quarter. With San Diego leading 69-60 with 7:18 left in the period, San Antonio ran off 10 unanswered points and outscored the Clippers, 24-6, to take an 84-76 lead going into the final period.

San Antonio shot 76 percent from the floor in the third period, while San Diego hit on only 21 percent of its field goal attempts. San Diego scored only 14 points in the third quarter.

"We had a big lead at the start of the third quarter and I think the Spurs realized we were going to beat them for a third time," said San Diego forward Michael Brooks. "Then they really came at us hard."

Also scoring in double figures for the Spurs were forward Mike Mitchell with 21 and

Mike Bratz and Gene Banks with 14.

San Diego was led by rookie Al Wood with 22 points, while Tom Chambers added 18 and

Jerome Whitehead had 17.

The victory increased the Spurs' lead in the NBA Western Division race to 4½ games over the Denver Nuggets.

Hagler-Hearns fight to be held May 24

NEW YORK (UPI) — For the winner, it will be another multi-million dollar payday against either Sugar Ray Leonard or Wilfred Benitez. For the loser, it's uncertainty and having to prove himself again.

Those will be the stakes when world middleweight champion Marvin Hagler defends his title against former World Boxing Association welterweight champion Thomas Hearns May 24, most likely in Reno, Nev. The winner will be in excellent position to face either Benitez, the World Boxing Council junior middleweight champion who is looking for a fourth title, or Leonard, who is seeking a third title and who won the undisputed welterweight crown by stopping Hearns in 14 rounds last September.

"Whoever wins this fight will be the key target for Benitez and Leonard," said Emanuel Steward, Hearns' trainer-manager who would love to get a rematch with Leonard.

A Leonard-Hagler match was in the early stages of negotiations, but Leonard's lawyer, Mike Trainer, wanted Hagler to come down to the junior middleweight division, 154 pounds. Hagler fights at 159. Hearns is expected to weigh 155.

"This man is the middleweight champion," Hearns said. "Why should he come down to the junior middleweight division? It would be very stupid of him to go down to 154."

Hagler will receive about \$5 million, while Hearns will net approximately \$3 million for the bout, which is to be televised by both closed circuit and cable television.

UT moves further in AIAW tourney

AUSTIN — Freshman Annette Smith scored 30 points and grabbed 11 rebounds Tuesday night to lead the University of Texas to a 73-61 AIAW victory over Wisconsin and into the AIAW national semifinals.

Texas, which won its 31st consecutive game to tie a school record, will meet the winner of the California Berkeley-Wayland Baptist game in the semifinals Friday night in Philadelphia. Rutgers will meet Villanova in the other semifinal game.

Sophomore guard Terri Mackey scored 13 points for Texas and had out 13 assists, and Joy Williams added 15 points. Chris Pruitt led the Badgers with 13 points and four other players had 11.

Sixth-ranked Texas takes a 34-3 record into the semifinals as the tournament's top-seeded team.
