ne unwittingly became involved in a scheme to smuggle 15 fully armed Cobra helicopters out of the United States could be sentenced to five years in prison.

Carl M. Kulingian, 34, of Encino, Calif., pleaded guilty Tuesday to conspiracy to export products of war

He told U.S. District Judge Robert Porter that he remained in the scheme to smuggle \$15 million load to Iraq once he NO learned what it was because he feared for his life. COUP Porter set an April 14 sentencing date for Kulingian, head of a Los Angeles executive employment agency, who faces a


