Bendix book

DETROIT - Mary E. Cunningham is writing a book about being the target of rumors that a romantic relationship with Bendix Corp. Chairman William Agee was responsible for her rapid rise in the company's ranks, a newspaper says.

In a copyright story Tuesday, the Detroit News said Cunningham is putting the book together in her spare time from "copious notes and a diary."

Cunningham resigned from Bendix Oct. 9, 1980, because of rumors she became a vice president because of a romantic re-

lationship with Agee.


