## Aquatics to swim in AIAW nationals

The Texas A&M Aquatics, a synchronized swim team coached by Marti Nix, will compete for the first time in the AIAW national meet this weekend. The meet is being held at Ohio State University.

Five members of the team will participate in the competition: Diana Tedder, Elizabeth Embree, Cheryl Stuart, Dawn Payne and Dawn Ruggles. The Texas A&M team became a varsity squad at the beginning of the semester, qualifying it for the national meet. Although the Aggies do not receive funds from the Athletic Department, the varsity status enables them to swim in meets like this one.

Synchronized swimming combines dance, gymnastics and swimming skills and includes two types of competition. In one form, figures are executed individually and judged on the degree of difficulty. In the other forms, group and solo routines are set to music and performed.

The Aggies won a meet with the University of Texas in Austin earlier in the month, winning the top two places in the senior, junior and novice divisions. Tedder, Embree and UT's Terry Allan won the top three spots, and Ruggles and Stuart took the top two places in the junior division.

In the novice group, Anne Sheppard, Dawn Gaston, Betsy Robison and Maria Giamfortune finished in the top four places.

The Aquatics will host their annual watershow April 22-24, with this year's show titled "Aquanotes." The event starts at 8 p.m. and tickets are available in the Memorial Student Center and through any members of the team.

## WBA champ wants out

# 'Forgotten' Weaver a burned out boxer

NEW YORK — People tend to be best at what they like to do, but Mike Weaver doesn't like fighting. And he's the World Boxing Association heavyweight champion.

Contending heavyweights hope he doesn't acquire a taste for it.

"I don't like to fight," said Weaver, who has signed to defend his title against fifth-ranked Randall "Tex" Cobb. "I want to get out of it as soon as I can."

In fact, Weaver did not put on a pair of gloves until he was 19.

"I was in the Marines at Camp Lejeune and got into a shoving match with this guy," Weaver said. "I hit him once and he knocked him out. He was the heavyweight champion of the base and the coach there asked me to come to the gym. That's how it all started."

Weaver, who has held the WBA title in virtual anonymity, could have made millions with his half of the title. However, he has been tied up in legal battles with his manager, Don Manuel.

Last year, he was signed to meet Gerry Cooney — who faces World Boxing Council champion Larry Holmes in a \$20 million fight on June 11 — but the WBA threatened to strip him of his title if he didn't meet James "Quick" Tillis. Weaver opted to keep his title.

"I'm the forgotten champion," said Weaver, 29. "I don't get the respect and recognition I deserve as a champion. I've had legal problems with my manager. Instead of fighting, I've been all tied up with those things."

Weaver, who won the title with a 15th-round knockout of John Tate March 31, 1980, has fought only twice since winning it — stopping Gerrie Coetzee in 13 rounds in October 1980, and taking a unanimous decision over Tillis last October.

Cobb, a 26-year-old native of Abilene, recently suffered a broken arm in a brawl outside a Philadelphia bar. The arm appears to be sound again and Cobb will have a chance to test it against unheralded Jeff Shellberg April 19 before facing Weaver, either in late May or late June.

## Gymnastics team to compete in state tourney in Lubbock

The Texas A&M gymnastics team will compete in the Texas Gymnastics Conference state championships Saturday at Texas Tech University.

The Aggies open with the team competition at 11 in the morning, with the finals scheduled for 7 p.m. Saturday night. The teams in the tournament in-

clude Texas A&M, Texas, UTA, Southwest Texas State, Lamar, Texas Tech and North Texas State University.

Competing for the Aggies will be Jim Gill, Mark Hartwell, Jim Foght, Juergen Achtermann, Ray Moltz, Todd Miellette, Esteban Longoria, John Kemp, Marty Hardell, David Semon and Al Arca.

Texas A&M's major competition will come from the host Red Raiders, UT and UTA. Hartwell, the team captain, has led the Aggies in most of this year's meets.

## BYU, Florida State win national tourney games

AMARILLO — Jeannette Weston scored 33 points to lead Brigham Young University into today's semifinal match against first-seed Florida State in the National Women's Invitation Tournament.

BYU downed DePaul 72-69 in a quarterfinal basketball game Thursday.

Florida State coasted to an easy 76-63 quarterfinal win over Pepperdine behind the 15-point shooting of both Glenda Stokes and LeeVan Oliver.

In the opening game, Illinois State fell behind 16-4 deficit in the first quarter, but came back to defeat Temple University, 74-69. The Redbirds were paced by sophomore forward Dawn Hallett's 18 points and junior Debbie Benak's 15.

Illinois State faces Oregon State in the semifinals today. Oregon State used 18 points by Judy Spoelstra and 16 by Cheryl Cady to down Southern Mississippi 71-65.

In the consolation round today, Southern Miss faces Temple and DePaul goes against Pepperdine.

The championship game will be Saturday.
