Decision on removal of pavillion delayed

The College Station City Council Thursday delayed approval of \$2,000 to remove a condemned pavilion in Oaks Park.

The council delayed action so further study could be conducted into alternatives on what to do with the pavilion.

The pavilion became a public hazard when one of the structure's main supporting poles broke several weeks ago. Closer inspection by park personnel revealed that the majority of the wooden structure's supporting beams had been eaten away by termites.

The pavilion was built in 1979 at an estimated cost of \$13,000. Examination of the structure's construction specifications showed that no provisions had been made to have the wood chemically treated aganist wood-eating insects.

In other action, the council approved \$47,250 for the purchase of a lot behind the city hall complex. After the city hall is enlarged, the newly acquired land will be used for parking
