

Six survive, one missing in crash

# Capsized boat leaves three dead

HIGHLAND BEACH, Fla. — An aging, 70-foot wooden Haitian freighter capsized and splintered in rough seas and heavy rain early Tuesday, killing three people and leaving at least one man missing in the choppy surf, the Coast Guard said.

Six men survived after swimming to shore and were found

walking down a busy beach highway in a daze. The bodies of two women and a man were pulled from the surf by rescue workers.

The hull and other parts of the Esperancia, an old wooden freighter, washed ashore behind a beachfront Holiday Inn in Highland Beach, an exclusive coastal community several miles

north of Boca Raton.

In October at Hillsboro Beach, just 20 miles south, 33 Haitian refugees drowned when their rickety sailboat capsized in turbulent waters off the coast.

At first word of the latest accident, officials feared the Esperancia also might be an alien smuggling vessel packed with Haitian refugees.

"There was some concern that this was a smuggling boat and there might be people trapped in small compartments," Coast Guard Petty Officer Mike Kelley said. "But that doesn't appear to be the case. There were only 10 on board."

Kelley said the Coast Guard said it did not receive a distress call and that the Esperancia, like

many aging Haitian vessels, probably was not equipped with a radio.

Survivors first told police there were as many as 25 on board, but later revised that down to 10.

At the time of the accident, surf along the south Florida coast was being churned up by heavy wind and rains.

# Thieves use crane to steal Indian

SAN ANTONIO — Police were searching for thieves Tuesday who apparently used a crane to steal a 2-ton brass Indian from atop an abandoned railroad depot where the statue had stood, bow and arrow poised, for 75 years.

Officials said the heist, which occurred sometime Saturday night, was a well-planned operation in which thieves used a heavy-duty

crane to remove the 15-foot-tall Indian — estimated to be worth \$100,000 — from atop the station's 88-foot dome roof.

"Whoever did this planned it out; it's professional," Efraim Abramoff, owner of the depot, said.

Abramoff said an anonymous informant tipped off police about the theft a week ago, but police didn't take the threat seriously.

# Clothing on display at museum

DENTON — An evening gown worn by first lady Nancy Reagan — now in safe storage at the Dallas Museum of Fashion at North Texas State University — is more than an elegant article of clothing, the museum curator says.

"It is a sociological record, like history books and paintings," Betty Marzan said. "We see it as much more than simply clothing."

"It is a reflection of many things, changing tastes and the changing role of women."

The gown is one of a dozen formal gowns, entertaining ensembles and natty suits worn by Mrs. Reagan, which have been distributed to museums across the nation. The gown was designed by Adolfo and worn by Mrs. Reagan June 30, 1981, at a dinner-reception for the Australian prime minister.

Mrs. Reagan's acceptance of gowns as gifts or "loaners" from renowned designers prompted criticism that she could not legally accept the clothes as gifts. Critics also challenged tax breaks designers got for loaning the clothes and then donating the fashions to museums.

Under a new policy intended to quell the criticism, Mrs. Reagan no longer accepts clothes on loan.

Marzan disagrees with the critics and the new policy.

"I feel as first lady she is required to appear at many functions and have a vast wardrobe," Marzan said. "It is an advantage to designers, an advantage for her and a way for museums to acquire noteworthy pieces of the designers."

"That's how museums grow."

The Dallas Museum of Fashion has grown considerably since it was donated to NTSU by Fashion Group Inc. of Dallas in 1972. The 5,000-piece collection represents every major designer and dates back to 1775, Marzan said.

The Adolfo gown worn by Mrs. Reagan was on public display for two weeks earlier this month, but it now is in storage to preserve the delicate fabric.

Marzan said the gown generally will be kept in storage and shown only in periodic exhibits.

But the design of the crepe de chine in one-shoulder styling with a puffed sleeve and a white abstract print will not be entirely out of the public eye.

The wife of former Dallas Mayor Robert Folsom owns an identical gown, Marzan said she is not distressed by the duplication.

"These dresses were never intended to be one of a kind," she said. "They represent various designers, and they obviously do several versions of a dress."
