GM pact accepted; AMC bargaining delayed

DETROIT — Workers at a Detroit plant whose jobs were saved by the revised General Motors Corp. agreement with the United Auto Workers union have jumped the gun and already have voted overwhelmingly to ratify the pact.

Official ratification voting was not scheduled to start until Thursday.

In another development Sunday, UAW representatives bargaining with American Motors Corp. caucused all day, delaying direct negotiating with the automaker on an employee investment plan. No details of the plan were available.

The workers at the Detroit

GM plant voted 129-9 Sunday in favor of the pact, which was hammered out in negotiations with the No. 1 automaker last week.

The voting by Local 329 apparently was valid even though it was four days ahead of the scheduled national balloting by GM workers. Union officials said the workers, whose jobs specifically were salvaged by the pact, were anxious to start ratification voting with a favorable margin.

The workers at the Detroit facility were slated to be laid off in the scheduled closings of that plant and six others. However, in exchange for worker concessions, GM agreed to keep four of

the facilities operating and to guarantee jobs for workers at the fifth.

Two will shut down as slated. Representatives of the union and AMC refused to release much information on the progress of their negotiations, which went into a marathon session Saturday night but were delayed Sunday by intra-union meetings.

Ray Majerus, UAW secretary-treasurer and director of the AMC department, had said there were some problems blocking an agreement but neither he nor a company representative would specify the areas of disagreement.

Woman puts police career on line with Playboy pose

SPRINGFIELD, Ohio — Barbara Schantz, a shapely, 25-year-old policewoman, may have put her police career on the line by posing nude for Playboy magazine.

Her superiors are expected to decide next week whether Schantz and the badge will go their separate ways.

Playboy's May issue, featuring a nine-page pictorial of Schantz in the buff, will reach Ohio newsstands April 5.

City Law Director James Peifer has been ordered to take a close look at the magazine spread, titled "Beauty and the Badge," before police officials comment on what action might be taken against the three-year veteran of the force.

Peifer said that in a meeting with the police chief, Schantz "indicated she would be clothed in the photographs," but in the text of the pictorial, the patrolwoman said she could not resist the opportunity to take off her uniform — and everything else — for the photo feature.

"I'd have regretted not posing," she said. "I'd have always

wondered what would have happened. I'm not too old to take a chance on something different."

Schantz said the decision to bare it all was partly the result of her chief having read the riot act when he learned she was consid-

ering posing for the magazine.

"When he started dictating to me, something inside me said, 'Hey! I'm not going to let him tell me what I can or can't do with my life,'" she said.
