

Druggist found innocent

AKRON, Ohio — A pharmacist has been found innocent in a possible precedent-setting case of substituting an unapproved generic drug for a prescribed one that allegedly led to the death of a woman.

The Summit County Common Pleas Court Friday found the defendant innocent of manslaughter.

Robert E. Cochran, owner of the Medicine Shoppe in Cuyahoga Falls, was accused of selling generic furosemide, a

diuretic, to Cleo Schell, 62, who died of congestive heart failure last April 3.

Cochran still faces sentencing later this month on charges of improper record-keeping and selling drugs without prescriptions.

Woman sent to jail then hospital after computer error

MIAMI — A Florida housewife was bounced from jail to jail, then sent to a state mental hospital, apparently because a police computer mistakenly identified her as another woman.

Miami Circuit Judge Herbert Klein is trying to untangle the web that snared Janette Elaine Cammock, 28.

Cammock's nightmare began in Miami last August when the Dade County state attorney's office issued bad check charges against a Miami woman using the name Jo Ann Hammock. The name and a description were put into the state-wide computer network of wanted persons.

Cammock — not Hammock — was picked up near Orlando by Orange County sheriff's deputies Jan. 29 for "bizarre" behavior. Police checked computer and determined she was the woman wanted in Miami for passing bad checks.

The next day, Cammock's husband, Oswald, filed a missing persons report with Orange County sheriff's office. He said his wife suffered from mental problems and he was worried about her.

Within five days of her arrest, Cammock was transferred to Dade County Jail where her mental condition deteriorated drastically, said officer James Holmes, Feb. 6, a psychiatric examination was ordered. She showed Cammock was suffering from an acute schizophrenic episode.

On Feb. 24, Cammock was transferred to the state mental institution.

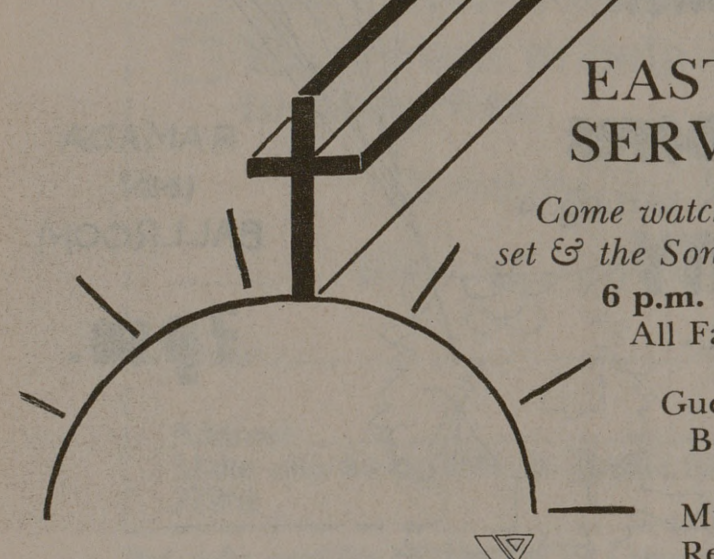


