Two of the agency's districts encompassing California and six other states in what is often considered the "gun-toting" West, reported a combined total of 2,298 sales involving 5,977 weapons.

"It staggers everyone who looks at it," Peter Mastin, assistant special agent in charge for the bureau in Florida, said Sunday

Officials with the Treasury Department's bureau say they believe many of the guns bought in Florida have been smuggled out of the country or illegally

sold in New York. Florida, Virginia and Ohio appear to be major sources of guns sold in the back alleys of New York, said Alex D'atri, a bureau supervisor.


