Agency head won't punish nuke officials

WASHINGTON — The chairman of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission says he is not planning to discipline officials who softened a report on possible deficiencies in nuclear plant pumps manufactured by a Vermont firm.

NRC Chairman Nunzio Palladino said Tuesday that an investigation is continuing into meetings between NRC officials and representatives of the Hayward Tyler Pump Co. of Burlington, Vt. Following the meeting, an agency report was changed, supposedly to satisfy objections by company representatives.

Palladino said tougher guidelines are being issued and a separate office of investigation is being created to prevent future problems.

However, he said, commission members think no disciplinary action is needed at this time. The NRC has been investigating charges by five former company employees about deficiencies in the pumps, which the firm supplies to some nuclear power plants.

Palladino said he learned in March that NRC officials from the regional office in Arlington, Texas — which has responsibility for overseeing nuclear vendors throughout the nation — "had provided copies of its draft inspection and investigation reports to company representatives."

He said a special investigation he ordered "found that contacts with company representatives were at less than proper arm's-length distance and they were not adequately documented."

He added: "As a result company contacts, NRC issued transmittal letter had softened."

One of the company representatives involved is Ma Rowden, who was chairman of the NRC from April 1976 to June 1977, and is now a Washington lawyer. He denies any wrongdoing.

"We did not believe at the time, nor do we now believe, there was any impropriety on our receiving these documents or in our commenting on them as we were asked to do by responsible NRC representatives," he said.

Karl Seyffrit, NRC's Dallas-based deputy regional administrator, said he changed comments in the report after he denied NRC could substantiate them.

Rep. Edward Markey, Mass., chairman of the House Interior Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations, demanded a shakeup in the regional office, claiming the incident "has totally and irrevocably compromised the results of this important investigation."

FBI says serious crimes stabilizing after 1980 highs

WASHINGTON — The number of reported serious crimes leveled off last year, generally matching the record figures that plagued the nation in 1980, according to an FBI report.

Preliminary FBI figures issued Tuesday showed reported property crimes remained nearly stable in 1981 while violent crimes edged upward by just 1 percent.

Among the reported violent crimes, only robbery rose — up 5 percent. Homicides dropped 3 percent, aggravated assaults fell 2 percent and rapes declined 1 percent.

Of property crimes reported, motor vehicle thefts dropped 4 percent, burglaries decreased 1 percent and larcenies-thefts showed no change.

FBI Director William T. Reilly said the stabilizing of reported crimes should prompt an easing of curbing pointing to the all-time high of 1980. The overall crime rate rose by 9 percent, with violent crimes up by 11 percent for year.

Last weekend, U.S. Attorney General William French Smith told an audience in Columbia, S.C., the incidence of violent crime has reached "crisis levels."

"In the time it takes to read my remarks this evening, an average of 50 violent crimes are committed across the country," Smith said.

"During that same period over 400 property crimes are committed. Last year, one out of every three households in this nation was victimized by some form of serious crime."

Houston scientists given \$1 million

HOUSTON — The Interferon Foundation of Houston has received a \$1 million contribution from the Samuel Roberts Noble Foundation of Ardmore, Okla., putting the total raised to \$9 million.

The money will be used to purchase of interferon, a potent substance made by the body and being tested for its anti-cancer potential.

The Noble Foundation biomedical division is engaged in basic cancer research and supported other interferon research, Leon Davis, head of the Houston group, said Tuesday. Among the institutions that have received funding from the Interferon Foundation are the University of Texas at Anderson Hospital, the University of California at Los Angeles, Yale University, New York University and the Medical College of Wisconsin.
