## CIA head Casey cleared in probe

WASHINGTON — A Justice Department investigation found that CIA Director William J. Casey did not violate the Foreign Agents Registration Act while working as a lawyer representing Indonesia in 1976, it was disclosed Thursday.

Attorney General William French Smith said the government's probe cleared Casey of any violation in connection with his work as a private lawyer for the Indonesian government.

"At all times, the fact that Mr. Casey was representing Indonesia was made clear to those officials with whom he was dealing," said Smith. "The evidence does not support a conclusion that at any time Mr. Casey sought to persuade or influence officials to change any agency policy."

The investigation found that Casey's representation of Indonesia was limited to efforts to obtain an agreement with the Internal Revenue Service as to the changes necessary in Indonesian oil production sharing contracts and the tax code to make sure the payments made under the contracts would be creditable under U.S. law.

Smith comments were contained in a report Wednesday to the U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in Washington, D.C., under the special prosecutor provisions of the Ethics in Government Act. A copy of the report was released Thursday by the Justice Department.

Under the law, the attorney general must open a preliminary investigation after receiving any allegations against high level federal officials. He must seek appointment of a special prosecutor if the charges are not frivolous.

A special prosecutor was appointed under the Ethics in Government Act last December to investigate allegations against Labor Secretary Raymond Donovan. The probe

is still continuing.

But in this case, Smith said he found the allegations involving Casey so "unsubstantiated that no further investigation or prosecution is warranted" and no special prosecution need be appointed.

Smith said the Justice Department investigation began in January after a Washington Post story alleged that Casey failed to file as a foreign agent while working for the Indonesian government.

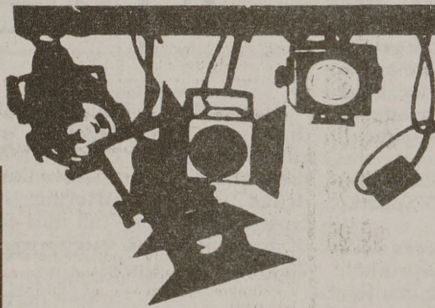
Under the law, a person seeking any changes in U.S. policy on behalf of a foreign principal must register with the Justice Department.

## Bullock blasts Reagan

AUSTIN — Comptroller Bob Bullock claims President Reagan's "cash management proposal" would require states to pledge their credit to the federal government, which is banned by the Texas Constitution.

In a statement distributed with copies of his letter to members of the state's congressional

delegation Wednesday, Bullock said the so-called "delay of draw-down" program strikes at the heart of Texas' pay-as-you-go provision in the state constitution.

"It is, therefore, absolutely impossible for this procedure to be implemented in Texas," Bullock told the delegation.
