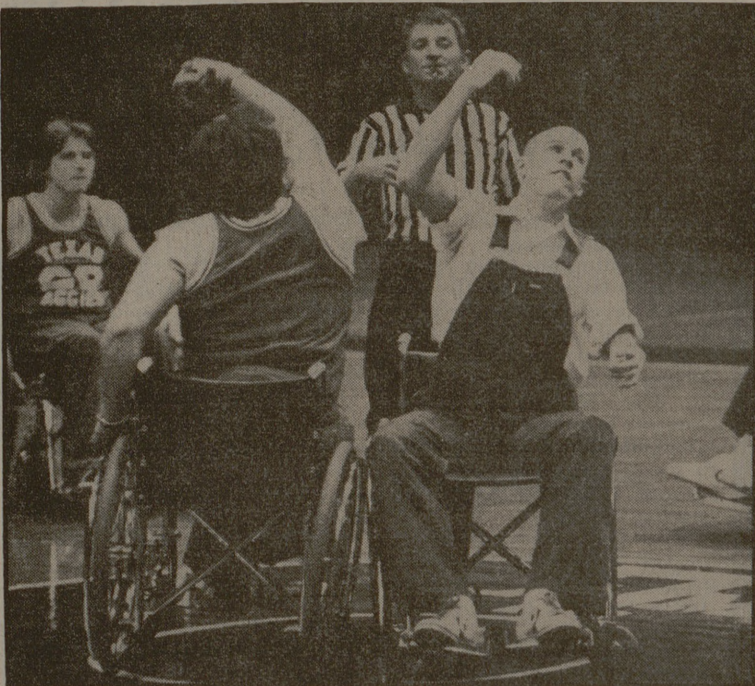

In triple overtime, Texas A&M defeated Lamar, 65-63, in the finals of the Prairie View A&M Basketball Invitational.

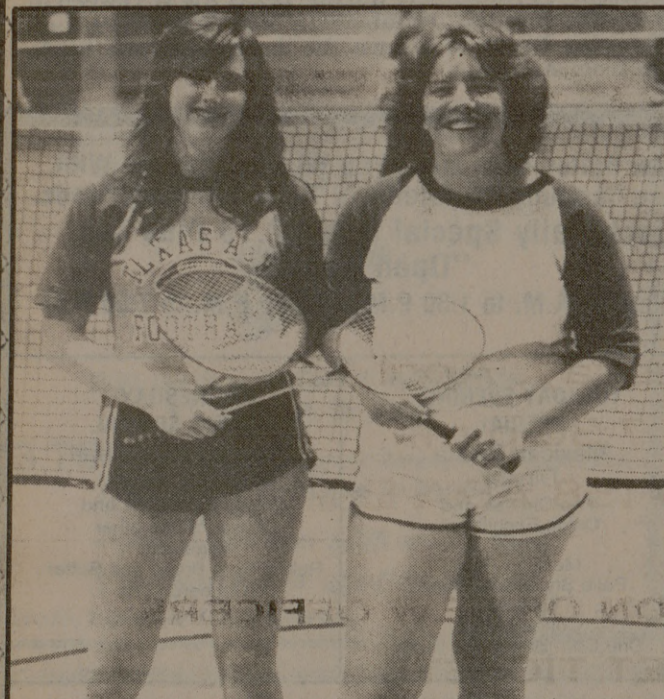

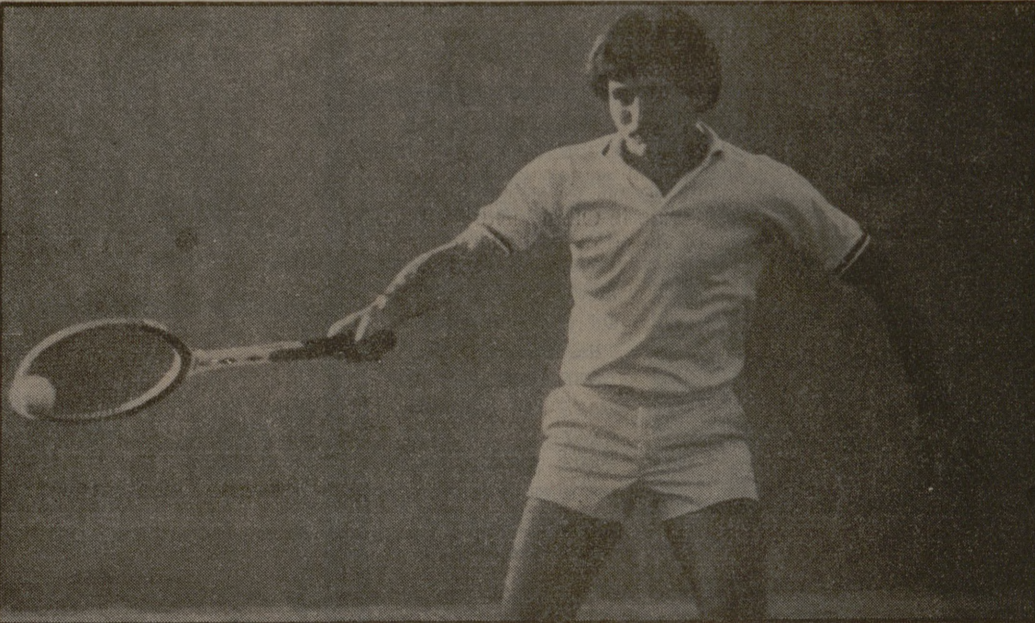

Congratulations to all who competed this year. Don't miss this summer's racquetball tournament.

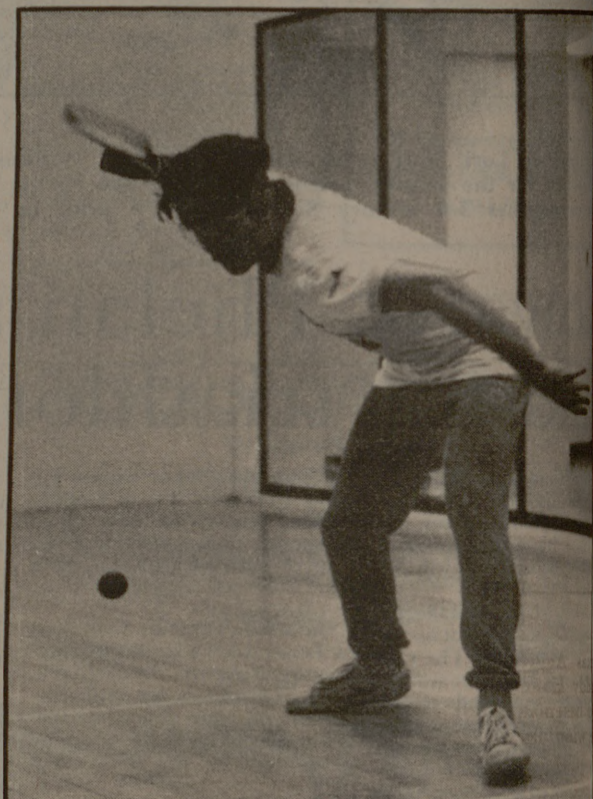

SOFTBALL PLAYOFF game times and dates are posted on Mondays. If your team is not scheduled, check next Monday.



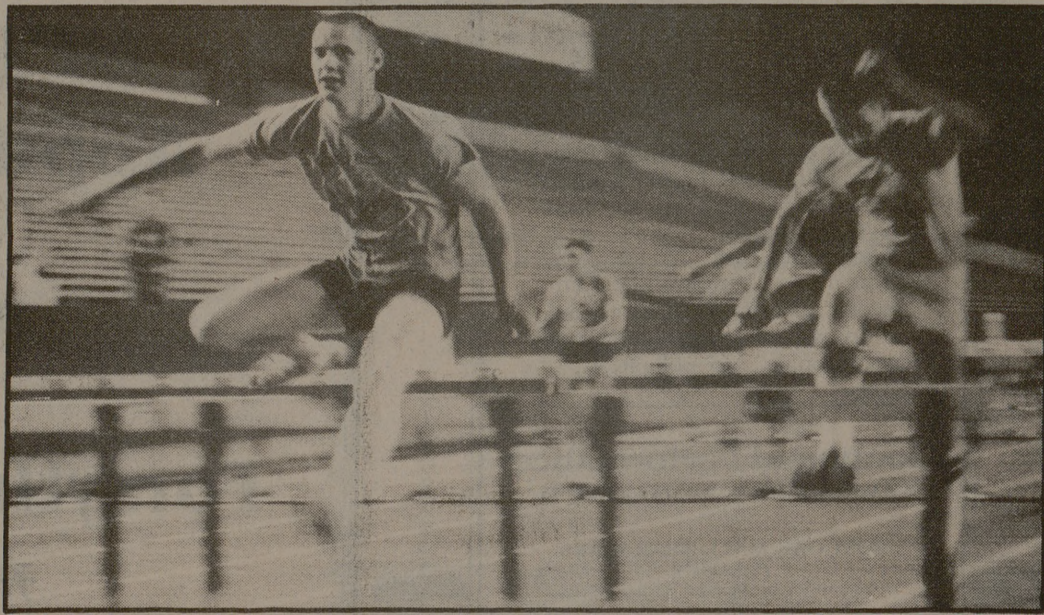
Racquetball singles finalist Mike Hare concentrates on his serve in the mens class A championship match.

Super Stars Schedule

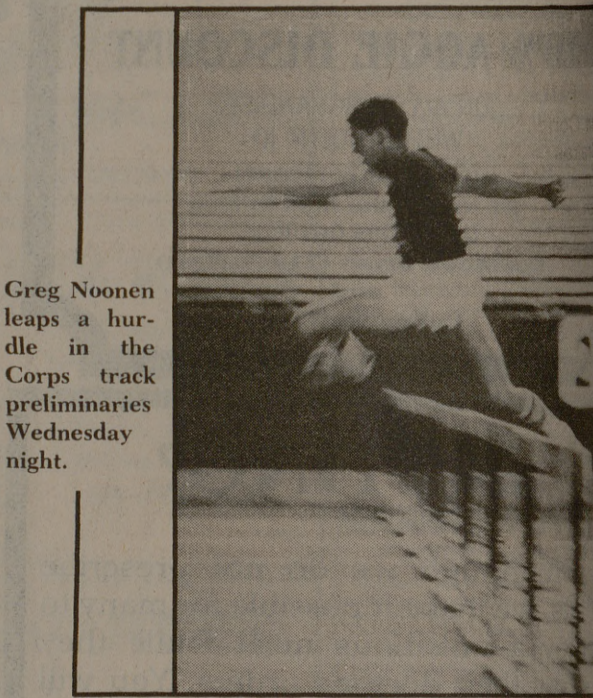
