SAN SALVADOR, El Salvador - Politicians struggled to form a coalition government Wednesday amid charges the U.S.-backed Christian Democrats were trying to wreck nego tiations and blackmail the right-

The Christian Democratic leaders Tuesday rejected a government of national unity proposed by five right-wing parties that competed against them in the March 28 elections for a constituent assembly.

Charging the proposed regime would diminish its power in the strife-torn Central American nation of 4.8 million, the Christian Democrats offered three alternatives for a new gov

The first calls for a coalition the moderate Christian Democrats, rightist parties and the Salvadoran army. The second calls for rule by Christian Democrats, the ultraright Nationalist Republican Alliance and the rightist National Con-


