## NBA playoffs Hawks not sharing Braves' success

United Press International Two professional sports franchises in Atlanta made headlines Sunday, but only

one looked good doing so. The Atlanta Braves have won 11 straight games for a modern National League re-cord. The Atlanta Hawks just needed to win one game Sunday to make their NBA play-

off chances easier, and they didn't. Because of an inopportune 99-96 loss to the Washington Bullets as the NBA regular season ended Sunday, the Atlanta Hawks


