Nuclear plant fire poses no danger, NRC official say

SURREY, Va. — No appreciable amounts of radiation escaped in a fire at the Surry nuclear power station, but it will take another day to determine exact levels of radiation leakage, a Nuclear Regulatory Commission spokesman said Sunday.

No injuries were reported in the Saturday afternoon fire in a storage building. The storage building housed contaminated reactor parts and equipment at the Virginia Electric and Power Company facility 50 miles southeast of Richmond.

Officials said smoke carried low levels of radiation into the atmosphere and water contaminated in extinguishing the fire ran into the James River, but neither posed any danger.

NRC spokesman Ken Clark said the levels of contamination were well within federal safety standards.

He said the radioactivity that escaped into the atmosphere was 0.0025 percent of the limit the government considers safe. He said the contaminated water contained .02 percent of the allowable limit of radioactivity.

Vepco spokesman Dennis Hedgepeth said the storage building is not connected to the

reactor buildings, and neither of the facility's two reactors was affected.

Hedgepeth said Vepco officials think the fire may have been caused by an electric heater used to dry mildly radioactive parts. He said about 30 percent of the storage building was severely damaged, but no specific damage estimate had been made.

Victim, assailant often strangers to each other

WASHINGTON — Nearly three of every five violent crimes are committed by people who are strangers to their victims, and men are more likely to be victims than women, a Justice Department study reported Sunday.

The department's National Crime Survey reached its conclusion by examining data for rape, robbery and assault from 1973 through 1979. It said an estimated 23.4 million of these crimes were committed in the United States during this period — an average of about 3 million per year.

The study did not cover murder and kidnapping.

The survey said men were three times more likely than women to be victims of violent crime at the hands of strangers.

It said blacks were more than twice as likely as whites to be robbed by strangers, but whites were more likely to be victimized by simple assault. The likelihood of rape by strangers was about even for both races.

"Americans age 12 and over were victims of violent crimes by strangers at an average rate of 20 victimizations per 1,000 people over the 1973-79 period," the survey said. "Robbery and rape were the two violent crimes

most often committed by strangers."

During that six-year period, 59 percent of violent crimes were by strangers.

In rapes and assaults by stran-

gers, the study said, the typical criminal was a white male over 21 years of age. It said young assailants did not appear to be singling out the elderly as victims of robbery and assault.
