TUSKEGEE, Ala. — About 50 civil rights marchers who hope a 1960s-style program." hope a 1960s-style protest will help extend the Voting Rights Act converged Monday for the start of a months-long trek

across five states to Washington. The Rev. Joseph Lowery, director of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, said marchers will cross Alabama, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia, organizing voter registration drives along the 2,000-mile route.

The marchers expect to reach Washington in late June or early July and Lowery said they may erect a tent encamp-ment on Capitol Hill similar to the "Resurrection City" pound built during the 1968 "poor people's march." Tuskegee Mayor Johnny Ford said: "Clearly we've got to




