United Press International HOUSTON — A Polish seaman who jumped overboard one day before his ship left a Port of Houston dock was calm and in good shape, a city councilman says.

The seaman, 21, who is applying for political asylum in the United States, slipped from the cargo ship Zabrze Friday. He is the 12th Pole to jump ship in Houston since the Polish government began its crackdown on dissidents. The seaman, who refused to give his name, told Councilman
