Braves take 13th straight, 4-3

The Braves walk alone in the National League record book and they may have to thank Matt Sinatro's shoe for it.

Atlanta won their 13th

straight game since opening day, when Claudell Washington lined a sharp two-run single with the bases loaded to give the Braves a 4-3 victory over the Cincinnati Reds Wednesday

night, breaking the all-time NL mark set by the New York Giants in 1884.

But it was Sinatro's footwear that kept the inning alive in the first place.

The Braves trailed, 3-2, to start the ninth when Sinatro, a reserve catcher, led off with a walk and Rafael Ramirez' attempted sacrifice got by Bob Shirley, 0-1, for a hit.

One out later, Brett Butler hit what appeared to be a double-play grounder toward shortstop Dave Concepcion. But the ball careened off Sinatro's heel and the Braves still had runners on first and second with two out. A wild pitch and an intentional walk to pinch-hitter Biff Pocoreba set up Washington's heroics.

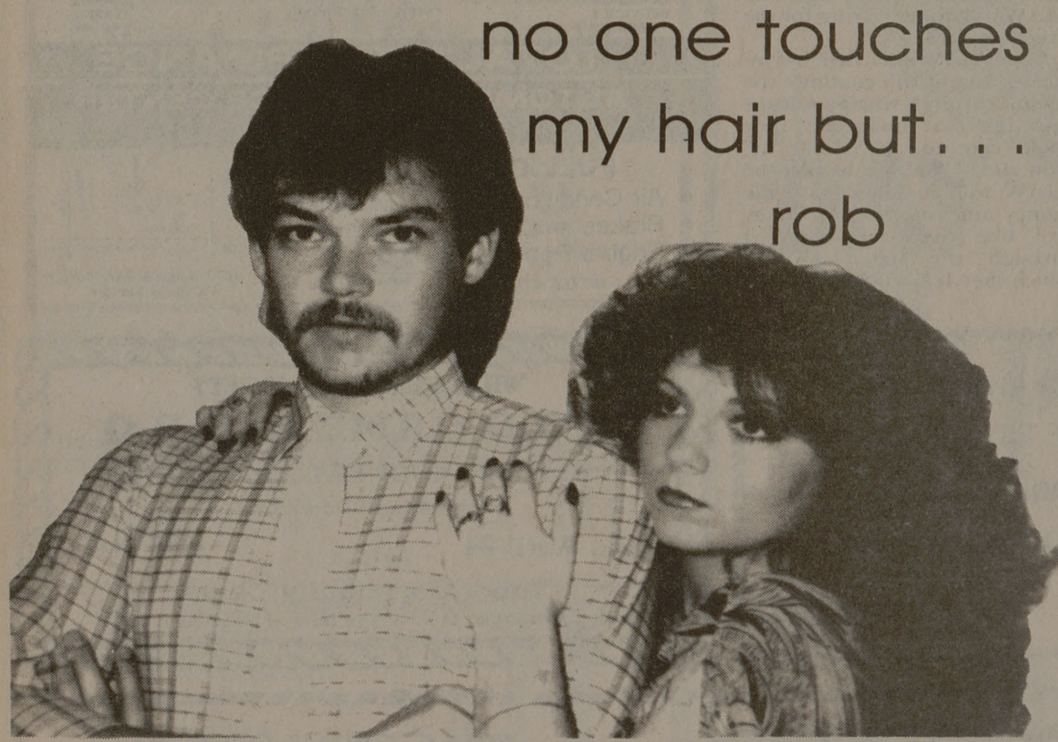
"I was concentrating on getting a good lead," Sinatro said. "I started to take off, but at first I thought it (the ball Butler hit) was a line drive and I may have hesitated a moment. The ball just nicked the back of my left foot."

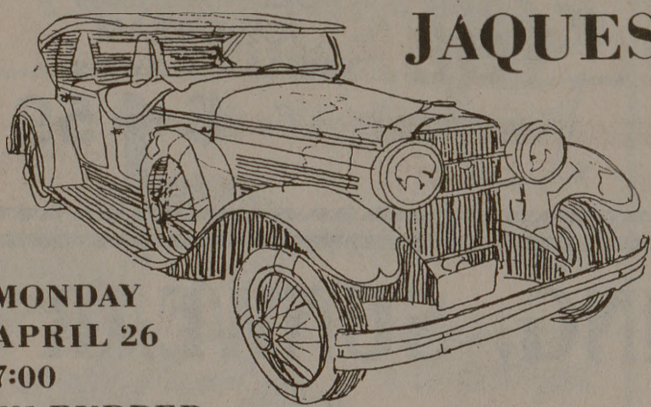

Rangers hold on to defeat Indians after weather delay

ARLINGTON — It's one thing to have a baseball game interrupted by rain — it's expected. But it's another thing to have a rain delay a game with one out to go.

In one of the more bizarre endings in baseball history, the Rangers held on to defeat the Cleveland Indians, 4-2, Wednesday in Arlington Stadium.

With two outs in the top of the ninth, reliever Steve walked Mike Hargrave just as raindrops began to fall. Thornton was up next, but before a pitch could be thrown, crackled, lightning flashed and rain poured.

The spectators went home, but players had to wait 35 minutes for the final out.

Comer later walked Thornton to put the tying runs on base. "It was kind of weird," Ranger manager Don Zimmer said. "It might be the first time I've seen anything like you could hear were the two teams."

The game most likely would have beaten the rain had it not been for 13 time-consuming walks.

Designated hitter Mike Richardt, entering the game 147, drove in two runs to lead the Rangers, while Doc Medich and Comer scattered eight hits. Medich, who lost to the Indians 13-1, in the second game of the season, gave up just one run before Comer came on in the sixth inning.

The Indians scored their only runs in the sixth and seventh innings after the first two batters reached base.

Zimmer said he did not hesitate to send Comer back to the mound. "Zim asked me 30 minutes into the delay if I wanted to give him a definite yes," said Comer, who recorded three saves of the season.

The game was a confidence builder for Richardt as the old may have broken out of his 5-for-34 slump.

"I always come around, but I like to get a good start. Tonight and I felt good."

Oral Roberts' Titans whip Texas Tech, 8-2

TULSA, Okla. — Keith Mucha and Jeff Baker each hit two-run home runs to lift Oral Roberts to an 8-2 victory over Texas Tech.

Mucha, who batted third, hit his 10th home run of the season in the third inning Wednesday to give the Titans a 2-1 lead.

Baker added his third home run of the year as part of a seven-run inning to increase the margin to 8-1 prior to the Raiders' final tally, which resulted from three walks and a single in the top of the ninth.

Titan starter Sean Mucha earned his second win with many decisions and the second without a walk. Raider starter Eric Shipe pitched a scoreless eighth.

The Titans boosted their record to 32-7 and Texas Tech slipped to 19-20.
