## Houston councilman called by grand jury

HOUSTON — A Houston city councilman named in Brillab testimony and in tape recordings as target of a 1979 bribery plot appeared before a federal grand jury Thursday in response to a subpoena.

City Councilman Jim Westmoreland was accompanied by his wife, Mary Sue, and his lawyer, Tom McDade, who said he expected Westmoreland to be indicted despite repeated denials of wrongdoing.

McDade said Wednesday unnamed federal sources had told him an indictment had been

testified he was given \$5,000 as a campaign contribution. Westmoreland filed no campaign finance report for the period.

The case arose from an FBI undercover operation called Brillab — short for bribery-labor — in which convicted swindler Joseph Hauser was used to test the susceptibility to bribery of labor leaders and other officials.

As a result of that sting operation, Garrett and Moore were convicted Feb. 25 of using a telephone in interstate commerce to promote bribery and were sentenced to five years probation and fined \$10,000 each. They are appealing the judgement.

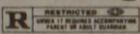

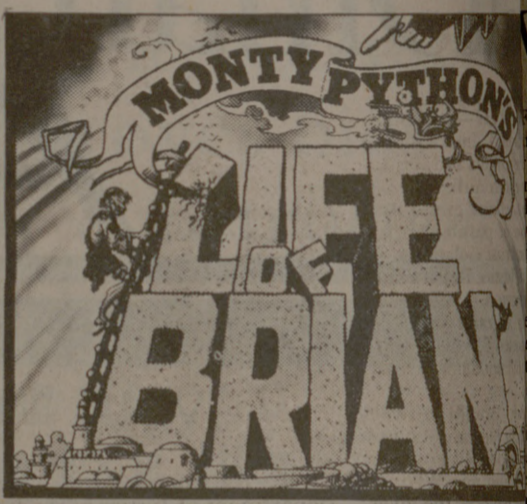

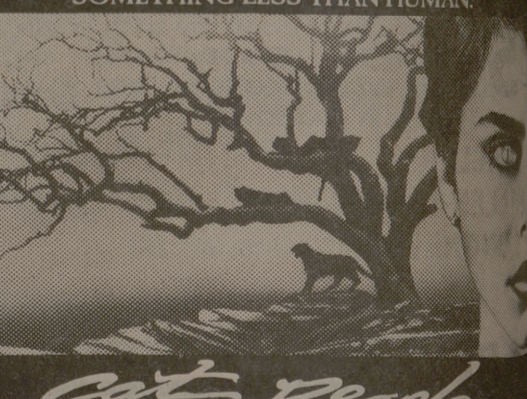
