Clements met privately with Lt. Gov. William P. Hobby and Speaker Bill Clayton for about 90 minutes Monday announced they had agreed unanimously that a special session was necessary.

"We've had an interesting meeting with much discussion, and I think we've probably considered all the alternatives and all our options," the governor said.


