

Army finds 35 dead near Mexican crater

MEXICO CITY — Army rescue units were unable to reach eight villages around the base of southern Mexico's Chichon Volcano but found 35 dead in another hamlet farther from the crater, the Defense Ministry spokesman said.

A ministry spokesman said Wednesday that soldiers had formed a circle around a three-mile radius of Chichon but have not been able to push closer because knee-deep 400-degree hot ash was blocking advances.

He said the eight villages all are within the three-mile "critical circle."

He listed the hamlets as Agua Tibia, Esquipula Guayabal, Las Flores, San Antonio, San Isidro Tanchital, San Juan Bosco, Volcan and Volcan Chichonal.

A helicopter was able to land in the only other town within the circle, Francisco Leon, but had to leave before rescue workers could look for bodies, the spokesman said. He said soldiers would return as soon as rains cool the searing ash.

Chichon, about 400 miles southeast of Mexico City, has belched out more than a billion tons of ash and cinders in a

series of eruptions that started March 28. Ash has been blown as far north as California and Texas.

The spokesman cited army reports showing 58 bodies had been recovered by soldiers as of Wednesday and three military men and a volcano specialist have been missing for more than three weeks.

He said 93 people were seriously injured and 26,224 were housed in government refugee centers. But he said most of the refugees had left the centers, many returning to villages outside the danger area.

It is possible to take advantage of discounted fares that may have time limitations or other conditions. Check with the airlines or travel agents because some cur-

The Eurailpass must be purchased before leaving the United States — it is not sold in Europe. If you're under 26, a second-class Eurail Youthpass is available that sells for a reduced rate.

Both passes provide free or reduced rate passages on many bus and ferry routes in the member countries: Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Greece, Holland, Ireland, Italy, Luxembourg, Norway, Portugal, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland and West Germany. Cut-rate passes also are sold by the railways in Britain and Northern Ireland as well as the individual railroads on the continent.

World's Fair gets mummy

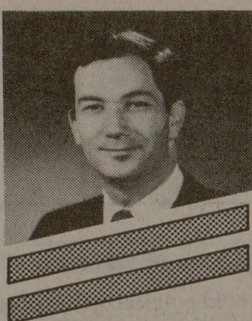
Promoters had feared the
