Earth's
future
gloomy

NAIROBI, Kenya — In a year 5 million children in the developing world are killed, another 5 million blinded, permanently paralyzed by six diseases — diphtheria, measles, polio, tuberculosis and whooping cough.

One million children in the Third World die every year from malaria. It infects another child under 3 in the countries.

The world's deserts are growing, gobbling up so much land that "desert creep" threatens the lives and lives of 700 million people.

Add to nature's deeds made pollution and disregard for the environment and prospects for a pleasant existence on Mother Earth are good.

So says a 69-page document on the state of the world environment presented by the executive director of the United Nations Environment Program, Dr. Mustafa Tolba, to the governing council of UNEP in Nairobi.

The report is mostly bad news for earthlings.

It says some progress has been made in the past 10 years, but "the overall state of the environment has not improved."

"Indeed, deterioration is proceeding at accelerated rates in a number of areas," it said.

Poverty and population are the most stress on the Earth environment. The Earth population passed 4.4 billion in 1980, an increase of 700 million — three times the population of the United States.

Food production has increased in the past decade, but has failed to keep up with population growth. A total of 450 million people are chronically hungry or malnourished.

The report estimated that 2000, when world population hits 6.3 billion, food production 60 percent higher than now would merely maintain current consumption patterns — starving will still starve.

Mushrooming cities cram more than 1.8 billion people — 41 percent of world population — into urban environments, often in squalor.

A quarter of them, mostly in the Third World, have no access to fresh water. More than half have no sewage facilities.

Despite worldwide clean-up campaigns, world weather patterns are being threatened by pollution.

"Emissions of airborne pollutants which have detrimental impacts on various ecosystems and transported over long distances have increased," the report said. "There has been slow but steady increase in carbon dioxide levels in the atmosphere."

The carbon dioxide increase threatens a greenhouse effect warming the climate several degrees, melting snow and ice and raising sea levels dangerously. More than 70 billion tons of carbon dioxide are now in the atmosphere, the report said.

Acid rain, caused by pollutants returning to Earth via rain, is a serious concern of industrialized countries. The acid rain kills fish, pollutes water, serves and rots buildings.

But for all the doom and gloom, the report also has snippets of good news.

"The open ocean is in no imminent danger," it says.

"Marine pollution problems have been blown all out of proportion," Dr. Stejan Keckes, UNEP's director of regional seas said. "Oil spilling is not the end of the world. Oil pollution constitutes a cosmetic problem rather than a real pollution problem."
