# Woman blocks removal of dead mother's body

SHREVEPORT, La. — A shotgun-toting woman, 62, held police and ambulance attendants at bay today, refusing to allow them to remove her elderly mother's body from her home.

Carrie Hill reported her mother's death to police about 2:30 a.m., but apparently became upset when an ambulance arrived to take her mother's body to a morgue.

She refused to allow ambulance attendants into the house and would not admit that her mother, Clara Wagner, had died, said ambulance worker James Upchurch.

"She was calm and OK until she saw the ambulance," Upchurch said. "I came in slow and parked up ahead of the house, but evidently she'd been anticipating it."

"She knew what it was for either." Police barricaded streets around the house in the Cedar Grove section of Shreveport. A Special Response Team was called to the scene, but officers apparently were hoping the woman would surrender after a short while.

# Parking Lot 7 to be closed; 450 spaces lost

About half of Parking Lot 7 in the Texas A&M campus will be closed by October, says Thomas R. Parsons, director of traffic and security.

Parsons said planned expansion of the Halbouty Building will cause the loss of about 200 faculty/staff parking spaces in the lot, which is behind the Reed McDonald and Halbouty buildings.

Construction of a physics and engineering building next to the cyclotron, to begin in May or June 1983, will eventually cover the rest of the lot, leaving only about 40 or 50 spaces for service vehicles, he said.

The lot now contains more than 500 parking spaces. "We are experiencing a lot of growth now, so things aren't going to be as easy as they once were," Parsons said. "Unfortunately, I think professors would rather have parking than tenure."

According to the traffic regulations, he said, the cars which normally park in Lot 7 will go to lots 50 and 51 by Zachry Engineering Center. This will displace day student and random parking from those lots, he said.

A short-range solution for the parking situation, which will go into effect in September, has been decided on, Parsons said. The plan includes the following details:

- Day student parking will be allowed on New Main Drive from Texas Avenue to the System Building, but not along the canal.
- Red permit parking will be allowed on the Coke Street bicycle lane by the Corps area.
- The section of Coke Street

from Lewis Street to Jersey Street will be for day student parking.

- Both sides of Throckmorton Street from the president's house to Jersey Street have been designated blue permit parking.

- Any legal parking permit will be allowed on Beef Cattle Road across the railroad tracks.
- Blue permit parking will be allowed on the Agronomy Road extension from West campus to the Veterinary Medicine Complex.

Parsons said Texas A&M's parking situation does not seem so bad when compared with the problems at the University of Texas. UT has 8,300 parking spaces; Texas A&M has 18,000 parking spaces.

Reactions concerning the elimination of Parking Lot 7 from people who park there are varied.

Jane Denoux, senior secretary for the geophysics department, said she would rather have the new wing added to the Halbouty Building rather than Lot 7. However, she added, the lack of parking spaces will "be a big inconvenience for a lot of people."

Dr. Clair Nixon, assistant professor of accounting, said he is concerned with where the people will park.

"I would prefer double- and triple-deck parking if it is economically feasible," he said.

Ramona Warren, senior secretary for the business analysis department, said the loss of parking spaces will cause a problem in interviewing new clerical staff.

"It's hard when you start hiring new employees and cannot promise them a parking space," she said.

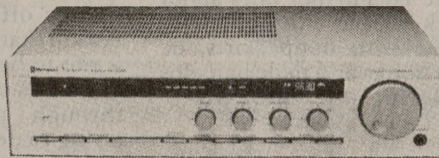
