The justices announced they will review next term a ruling that declared the use of home video equipment to record television programs — even for private use — violates copyright laws.

The ruling by the federal appeals court in San Francisco last October panicked the home video recording industry, which has blossomed into a billion-dollar enterprise that caters to home TV viewers.

"Rarely has there been a copyright case of greater public, commercial or academic interest," assert attorneys for Sony Corp., the Japanese manufacturer of the Betamax home video recorder named in the copyright lawsuit.

The popular recording devices are marketed with the idea of taping programs and moving off the air and replaying them later for family and friends.

The suit was filed by Universal City Studios Inc. and Walt Disney Productions, which complain that Americans are taping copyrighted movies and programs without paying royalties to the production companies.

With only a few exceptions, is against the law to reproduce copyrighted material.

The production companies sued Sony, along with its American distributor, four retailers who sold the devices, an advertising agency that promotes them and a home video user.

Overturning a lower court's 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals rejected Sony's arguments that the copying of film over-the-air telecasts for private in-home use is not illegal.

High court to decide Hughes suit

United Press International WASHINGTON — The Supreme Court volunteered Monday to help settle a complicated 6-year-old fight over which state — if any — can collect death taxes on billionaire reclusive Howard Hughes' estate.

Concluding that no other court has authority to settle the dispute, the justices voted 5-4 help seek an answer to the multi-million-dollar question whether Hughes was an official resident of Texas, California or Nevada when he died in April 1976.

Both Texas and California claim him as a resident for inheritance tax purposes. The Hughes estate claims he was a resident of Nevada, the one state that imposes no death taxes.

The action is a turnabout from the high court, which in 1975 refused to take up the same question. The justices Monday invited California to bring a complaint before the court after voting 6-3 in a separate ruling that a lower federal court did not have authority to settle the dispute.

The dilemma over who has authority to resolve the question of Hughes' permanent residence has delayed for years resolution of the real issue: how much money the Hughes estate owes to which state.

To Texas and California, the outcome will mean millions of dollars for their state treasury.

Estimates of the value of Hughes' assets range from the estate's low projection of \$180 million to California tax officials' appraisal of \$1.1 billion. The Internal Revenue Service says it is worth \$465 million.

Texas argues it deserves the tax Hughes' intangible assets because he was born and raised there, never gave up his permanent residence despite extensive traveling and died in a private jet en route to a Texas hospital. A Houston jury already has declared Hughes was a Texas resident.

But California claims Hughes as a resident because he lived there for 40 years, before taking up a roving lifestyle.
