Braves' pitcher hurls shutout as Astros tumble

"I really like to pitch in the Astrodome because you can challenge the hitters," said Walk, now 6-4. "Tonight was probably the best game of my career."

But Horner was looking forward to going back to Atlanta. "Tonight was our night," said Horner, who drove in three runs with a double and single. But he added he was looking forward to spending a good share of the next few game nights in Atlanta.

"Remember, we haven't had a long home stand yet this year, and all of us are looking forward to the next three weeks when we play the majority of our games at home," the Atlanta third baseman said.

Walk retired the first 11 batters he faced before Ray Knight singled with two out in the fourth. He pitched out of jams in the fourth and fifth, stranding five runners.

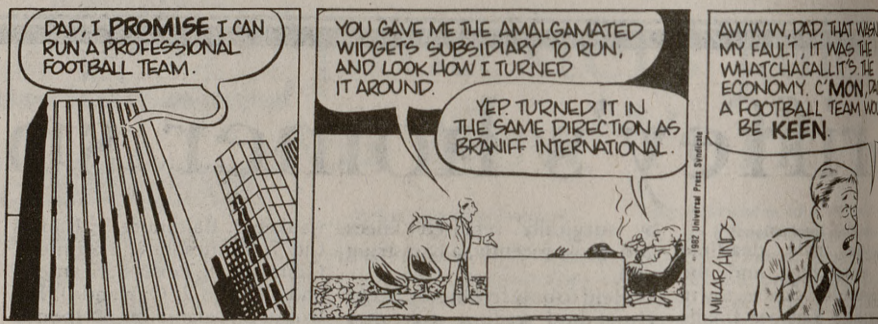
The Braves chased Bob Knepper, now 2-8, in the fifth when Washington was safe on an error by shortstop Dickie Thon, stole second and scored on an RBI single by Dale Murphy.

In the sixth, Rufino Linares walked, advanced to third on a single by Bruce Benedict and scored on a single to left by Walk.

Walk said: "I simply tried to throw strikes, hoping to get a lot of ground balls for easy outs. I was a little tight the first two innings, but I loosened up in the third and felt real good the rest of the way."

Hostetler gives Mariners headaches in 5-2 victory

SEATTLE — Since Dave Hostetler has only been in the major leagues 18 days this year, he may not be the best judge of major-league ballparks.

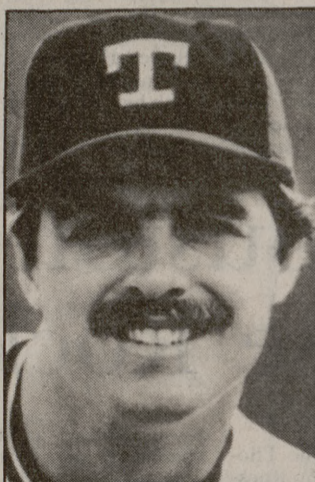
But he rates Seattle's Kingdome as one of the best. Hostetler was overflowing with praise for the Kingdome Tuesday night after he hit two homers and drove in three runs to power the Texas Rangers to a 5-2 win over the Seattle Mariners.

"I really like this place, it's awesome. It's a beautiful park," said the 6-foot-4 first baseman, who was called up from the minors by the Rangers May 28. "The ball carries real well here. I wish I could play all my games here."

At the moment, however, he could hit in any ballpark. In the 14 games since being called up, he has gone 15-for-46 with six homers, three doubles and a triple.

"I hit a couple of homers before I was called up, so I guess you could say I'm a streak hitter, but I don't want to get that label," Hostetler said. "I want to be known as a line-drive hitter like Steve Garvey."

Hostetler's first homer of the night, a 390-foot solo shot in the second inning, made it 1-0.

Texas scored again in the third when Doug Flynn singled, stole second and scored on a double, the first of four hits by Buddy Bell.

Texas made it 3-0 in the fifth when Leon Roberts bounced into a bases-loaded fielder's choice to score Terry Bogener.

Solo homers by Julio Cruz and Al Cowens made the score 3-2 after seven. Hostetler blasted a 410-foot homer in the eighth, scoring Lamar Johnson,

who had singled leading off the inning.

Hostetler's hitting was the winner out of Frank Tanana, who went 6-for-7 in the game. Comer finished the game for the Rangers, picking up his save.

"It's been one of those nights," said Tanana. "It's been sledding, but you ask me — it's about as good as it can be."
