

McEnroe takes court today

Lloyd trounces Gerken

WIMBLEDON — Defending champion Chris Evert Lloyd, using her vast experience to quickly defeat her relatively inexperienced opponent, downed fellow American Barbara Gerken Tuesday, 6-0, 6-4, in the Wimbledon tennis championships.

Rain delayed play more than an hour and fewer than 20,000 people paid to attend compared with 32,516 on last year's second day.

Lloyd's 56-minute defeat of the 17-year-old from Thousand Oaks, Calif., was a second-round match even though it began the

women's championship. All 16 women's seeds drew first round byes, leaving Tuesday's curtailed play to those further down the order.

Gerken, who graduated from high school only a week ago, was playing her first match on Wimbledon's famed center court and her first on grass.

Lloyd has been a finalist here seven times in the past nine years and won the title in 1974, 1976 and last year.

Nerves cost Gerken the first set, although Lloyd applied relentless pressure in addition. The young California steadied considerably in the second set, but held her serve only once in

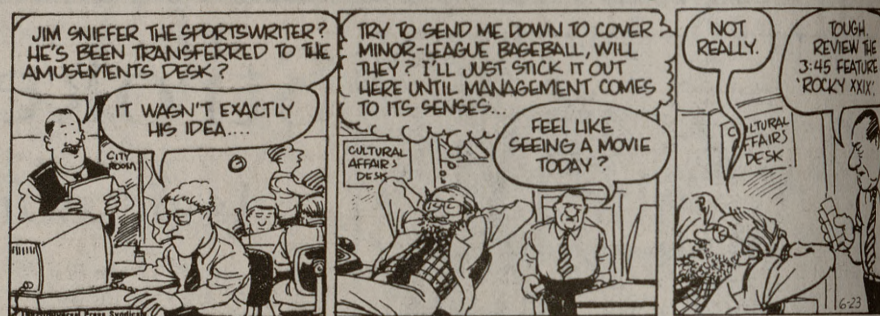
the match.

Lloyd and Gerken both used two-handed backhands and played with a similar style, but Lloyd's experience and steadiness made the difference.

In men's action today, John McEnroe will face South African Eddie Edwards in a second-round match.

Richard to pitch Monday

HOUSTON — Astros right-handed pitcher J.R. Richard, who suffered a stroke in 1980, is scheduled to pitch his first minor league game Monday, president and general manager Al Rosen said Tuesday.

Richard was assigned to pitch actively with the Class A Florida State League Daytona Beach club under the major league rehabilitation program.

He is scheduled for his first taste of organized competition in Monday's game against St. Petersburg (Fla.) of the St. Louis Cardinals' farm system.

Richard spent the first two months of this season at Sarasota, Fla., in the extended spring training program pitching in an informal setting.

Texas shuts out Angels, Carew, 4-0

ANAHEIM, Calif. — Rod Carew went down swinging. And having fun.

Rick Honeycutt scattered seven hits, snapping Carew's 25-game hitting streak in the process, and Jim Sundberg singled in two runs Tuesday night to lead the Texas Rangers to a 4-0 triumph over the California Angels.

Carew, who was 41-for-99 during the streak, went hitless in four at-bats. But the seven-time American League batting champ twice came close to keeping the skin alive.

In Carew's last at-bat, right fielder Johnny Grubb made a shoestring catch of a sinking liner. In his first at-bat, Carew drilled a sharp grounder off rookie first baseman Dave Hostetler's glove, but the ball skidded to second baseman Doug Flynn, who threw to Honeycutt covering first for the out.

"I'm not disappointed in myself because I swung the bat good tonight," Carew said. "I guess that's just the way it goes. I'm not disappointed at all. If I hadn't been swinging the bat well and was feeling for the ball, then I might be disappointed. "I had no intention to bunt the last time up. If I was going to end the streak it was going to come swinging. I enjoyed the streak. It was a lot of fun."

In completing his fourth game, Honeycutt struck out four and walked two for his third straight victory after dropping his first seven decisions of the season. He has now allowed only six earned runs in his last 35 innings of pitching.
