Negligence caused crash, judge rules

HOUSTON — A U.S. district judge has issued a \$1.1 million judgment against the federal government, ruling that two air traffic controllers' negligence caused the 1978 death of a pilot in a fiery crash landing at Intercontinental Airport.

Federal Judge George Cire blamed controllers Michael Varble and Boyd Archer for letting Terry William Lane, 24, land a twin-engine Beechcraft King Air too closely behind a commercial jet, court records showed Tuesday.

Lane, a pilot for J & W Refining Co. of Houston, and passenger Judith Nunnery, an off-duty air traffic controller, were killed in the March 19, 1978, accident.

Both Varble and Archer have been promoted to jobs as team supervisors with the Federal Aviation Administration.

"The failure to warn (Lane) of the possibility of wake turbulence was negligence," Cire ruled.

Cire also said: "Mr. Varble was negligent in issuing a communication that the jet traffic would be no factor to (Lane), a communication which had no precise meaning with the official jargon of air controllers and which amounted to a false reassurance to the pilot."

Although neither controller could be reached for comment, Federal Aviation Administration officials said no disciplinary action would be taken against

them because they were promoted in an earlier FAA investigation.

"We believe they were doing their duties properly at the time and it was just one of those things that happened," Cire spokesman George Bess said.

Burlage said the government will likely appeal Cire's ruling, the suit filed in 1980 by Lane's wife and parents.

The court awarded \$850,000 in damages to Lane's parents William and Betty Lane and \$229,390 in damages to Vanguard Insurance Co., Cravens, Dargan and Co., their payments covering property damage caused by the crash.

Jurors regret decision

WASHINGTON — John W. Hinckley Jr. Wednesday spent his first day in a mental hospital, while two holdout jurors said they deeply regretted agreeing under pressure to the verdict that he was insane when he shot President Reagan.

"I regret not holding out," said one of the disgruntled jurors, Maryland Copelin, 50, a

mother of four. "I'm sorry I disappointed the world."

Federal marshals hustled Hinckley aboard a helicopter late Tuesday and landed him inside the 20-foot walls of St. Elizabeth's mental hospital — to be his home for months, years or possibly the rest of his life.

As he was taken away, angry lawmakers demanded that Congress revise or abolish the statutes that allowed him to be found innocent by reason of insanity and escape a possible life prison term.

Hinckley's lawyers assured the public they will not try to win his quick release, and the parents of the president's assailant pledged they will take no steps toward obtaining his freedom unless it is determined he is harmless.

Hinckley is entitled by law to a hearing within 50 days of commitment to determine present mental state. If lawyers were to show that he no longer is dangerous to himself or society, he would be eligible for conditional release.

Two women jurors who voted out for three and a half hours with "guilty" votes said they regretted surrendering up the case from the other 10 jurors.

"I want the people to know what he did," said Patricia Brown, 30, a shop mechanic from Washington power company.

"We kept on holding out until you feel like you're at a breaking point," she said, just gave in. But we felt better after we did. We went to a dict that was unjust."

Brown and Copelin, who sat side by side in the jury box during the 42-day trial, expressed bitterness that the panel was closely sequestered that they felt pressured to wrap up the verdict so they could return home.

Brown said she believes Hinckley had a mental disorder but not so serious that he should be found insane, she said. She knew it was wrong to let Reagan and three other men

in nearby Washington, D.C., pay tribute to the president's assassination and ears to the general public.

The general public's reaction to any of the trial's details, including the fact that the president's assailant was found not guilty by reason of insanity, would be a violation of the law, she said.
