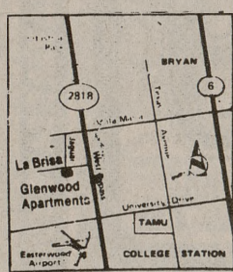

1981, costs surpassed profits in agriculture. Farm income for 1981 was \$23 billion, considerably less than \$32.7 billion in 1979, the May 1982 issue of Texas Monthly reported.

USDA figures show that the total farm debt was \$194.7 billion at the start of 1982. In 1979, it was \$136.1 billion. And the national delinquency rate on Farmers Home Administration loans is 58 percent, according to the magazine.

In Texas, the delinquency rate is 69 percent.

Generalizations about agriculture by the public don't help enrollment figures, either, Kunkel said.

Many people equate 'agriculture' with 'farming and ranching', he said. But most of the jobs today are not on farms and ranches, but in the more detailed areas of agriculture — agribusiness, government, education and financial institutions, he said.

Only about 12 percent of Texas A&M's agriculture college graduates work on farms and ranches.

Agricultural engineering and poultry science graduates are hired at up to \$25,000 starting pay. Graduates in some areas of food sciences and agricultural economics make similar salaries.

Money appears to be more important to students today than in the past, Kunkel said.

Now, students think they can make more money with an engineering or business degree than with an agriculture degree, he said.

While this is initially true, agriculture majors have more opportunity for advancement, he said.

Other agriculture colleges across the nation are facing similar enrollment trends.

Oklahoma State University's College of Agriculture experienced a 25 percent decrease in freshman enrollment this year, dropping the overall undergraduate enrollment by five per-

cent. The OSU agriculture college has 1,900 undergraduates and 375 graduate students. OSU offers 14 agriculture-related majors.

But, Kunkel believes at some universities, such as Cornell, Michigan State and University of California-Davis, will not be affected by this because of their selective. All are nationally-known their outstanding agriculture colleges.

Entrance requirements at these schools are higher than Texas A&M, and only a certain number of students accepted every year.

Texas A&M's agriculture college sets no quotas, but all students meeting University entrance requirements.

The obvious way to increase enrollment in agriculture colleges is to pull out of the pressure, Stenholm said. The students will have more desire to enter into the agriculture profession.

Congressman lets police use office in drug case

United Press International WASHINGTON — A congressman who allowed his office to be used for an undercover drug investigation said Tuesday he would not be surprised to see several of his colleagues implicated in cocaine trafficking on Capitol Hill.

Rep. Robert Dornan, R-Calif., said he readily volunteered his office for use by an undercover policeman after being approached by a senior officer of the Washington Metropolitan Police Department.

"Being a member of the (House) Narcotics Committee and feeling that narcotics is vir-

tually a plague in our country, I instantly agreed," Dornan said on NBC's "Today" show. "I never gave it a second thought."

The operation ran for several months during early 1981 and is believed to have led to the arrest of a former congressional page and the seizure of \$400,000 worth of cocaine from a Washington home, Dornan said.

Dornan said he was told the undercover operation "only involved cocaine being run around the Hill by House and Senate staffers."

He added: "There wasn't any

mention, other than rumors among members."

However, he acknowledged there have been persistent rumors of involvement by members of Congress and speculation that several could be named when a federal grand jury concludes its current investigation of the National Star-Garrett scandal.

"It appears from the frame and the collapse of the career of some people on Capitol Hill that maybe we are going to see a few congressmen named," he said. "I hope that it's just the few, if that. But lately, in the couple of days, there's the feeling that it's more than a few."

Vintage, novelty car auction draws \$1.6 million in sales

United Press International NEWPORT BEACH, Calif. — Thousands of American autoworkers are out of work and new car lots bulge with vehicles that can't be sold, but auctioneer Rick Cole managed to unload \$1.6 million worth of cars during the three-day holiday weekend.

Although he concedes many of the 420 automobiles placed on the auction block went for far less than previous years, as far as Cole is concerned, the automotive slump may be over.

"I guess you could say the American public is still autosexual," the super auctioneer, 28, said at the conclusion of his 10th Newport Beach Collector Car Auction. "People figure they are what they drive and they want to drive more than a Detroit box with a wheel on each corner."

Cole said the most vigorous bidding in his arena of classic, vintage and collector automobiles was for '50s and '60s

convertibles. Thunderbird

Packards and Rolls-Royces. One man drove away a 1957 Lincoln Turnpike Coupe that sold for only \$500, but top price paid during the Feb. 27 of July holiday auction was \$43,000 for a two-tone 1956 Rolls-Royce Silver Wraith.

Several notable celebrity automobiles stalled in the ding war.

Singer Pat Boone rejected bids of \$42,000 apiece for a pair of Rolls-Royce convertibles. Reserve price was \$50,000. And actor Telly Savalas rejected an \$18,000 bid for a pristine 1957 Thunderbird.
