Porn theater owner denies charges

United Press International NEW YORK — The owner of Manhattan live sex theater Tuesday denied allegations

made to a state crime commission investigating child pornography that he employed children in live homosexual shows. William Oates, who owns and

operates the Follies Theater in Manhattan, told the state Senate Select Committee on Crime that charges made by committee investigators about his theater

The committee was told Monday that a call-boy prostitution and pornography ring in Washington had sold information on its clients to Soviet, British and Israeli intelligence agencies, and that the ring was only part of a nationwide network operating in New York, Houston, Los Angeles, San Francisco
