"Ruhle had real good stuff tonight," Philadelphia manager Pat Corrales said. "We were hitting the ball real well, but right at somebody.


Houston manager Bob Lillis also lauded his pitcher.

fense and a team effort.


"The guys played great defense behind me and the balls that they hit really hard were right at our people," he said.
