



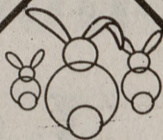

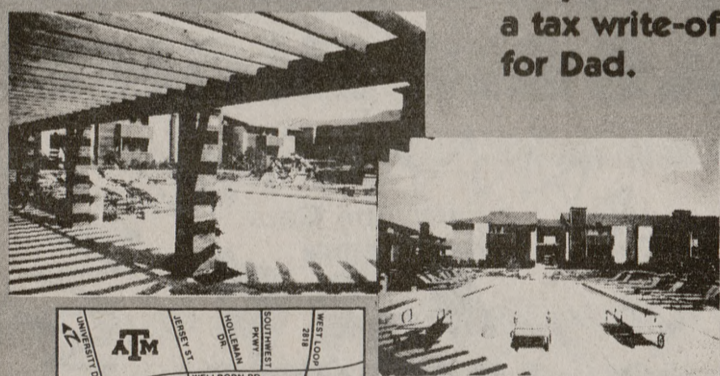

Solidarity anniversary today

Poland braces for riots

WARSAW, Poland — Hundreds of helmeted riot police set up water cannons at strategic intersections in downtown Warsaw Monday as Poland's martial law regime braced for demonstrations on the second anniversary of the banned Solidarity union.

"The decree of martial law makes the law and order forces absolutely responsible to ensure public order," the official Polish

news agency PAP said.

"In order to fulfill this duty, the organs of order may use the means of direct compulsion and, in special cases, they can be aided by units of the armed forces," PAP said, warning against demonstrations on Solidarity's second anniversary today.

Riot police armed with automatic rifles stood in three-man patrols at key Warsaw intersections and military and police

vehicles were parked on side streets and squares near the areas designated by the Solidarity underground as sites for demonstrations.

More than a dozen water cannons, over a dozen armored personnel carriers and scores of police buses, trucks and jeeps were counted in four strategic locations as the authorities mounted one of the biggest security operations since martial law was declared Dec. 13.

The only comparable building since December was in Mar when anti-government riots erupted in over a dozen cities nationwide.

Similar, but smaller police and military buildups were reported in Gdansk and Wroclaw but those cities were reported calm.

Warsaw officials issued three-day ban on the sale of alcohol.

U.S. man receives new lung

TORONTO — An American nursery owner who underwent a lung transplant operation because his lungs were rendered useless by the weed killer paraquat was in critical but stable condition Monday, doctors reported.

Spokesmen at Toronto General Hospital where the 6½ hour operation was done overnight Sunday said James Franzen of Marietta, Ga., was attached to an artificial lung as a precaution, but his new lung was "functioning very well."

Authorities said they were

very optimistic for Franzen's survival. His condition was described as "unchanged — critical but stable."

Franzen, 31, a nursery owner, lost use of his own lungs after exposure to the herbicide paraquat.

The donor lung, the object of a continent-wide search last week, was obtained from the body of Dennis Blakely, 25, of Decatur, Ga., by ironic coincidence a resident of Franzen's home state.

Blakely was accidentally shot in the head Friday while sitting in a car listening to a baseball

game on the radio. His body was flown to Toronto late Saturday where a 30-member medical team was assembled to make the transfer. The donor's kidneys were also removed and sent back to the United States for transplantation.

"I know it was the right decision," said Ruth Blakely, the donor's mother. "We just hope that if anything good could come out of such a senseless tragedy, we could make it happen."

None of the 38 previous recipients of lung transplants is living. The Toronto hospital, the

only center in North America with the facilities to perform this sort of operation Franzen required, has performed one previous lung transplant in 1977. The patient survived 18 days after surgery.

The longest any lung transplant recipient has lived is 8 months, but four patients at California's Stanford Medical Center who have received combined heart-lung transplants are still alive, the longest more than a year after surgery. The California hospital has only performed the combined transplants.

Shortest papal trip to oldest republic

SAN MARINO — In the shortest state visit ever made by a pontiff, Pope John Paul II paid a four-hour visit to the mountaintop mini-state of San Marino, the world's smallest and oldest republic.

John Paul's trip Sunday was the first official visit by a pope to San Marino, the 23-square mile country nestled atop Mount Titano in northeast Italy.

The republic, with about 21,000 residents, was founded in 301 A.D. by St. Marinus, a Balkan stonemason, as a refuge for Christians fleeing persecution by the Roman emperor Diocletian.

Like the Vatican, which at 108 acres ranks among the world's smallest sovereign states, San Marino derives a good part of its revenues from tourism and postage stamps.

Like the Vatican, San Marino has a tiny, colorfully dressed ceremonial security force — the 200-man Grand Council Guard.

But for the papal visit, the republic called in about 300 Italian paramilitary police to help provide protection.

John Paul drew prolonged applause from the highly patri-

otic residents of the city-state when, on arriving by helicopter, he kissed the ground as he drove whenever he visits a new country.

In the 15th century government palace, the pope addressed the leaders of San Marino, which is run by a Communist-Socialist coalition. He walked up a steep, cobblestone street to pray before the remains of St. Marinus in the republic's basilica.

The pope said mass before some 10,000 residents in San Marino's only sports stadium and told worshippers they should carry on the tradition of their founder by working to end religious persecution in other parts of the world.

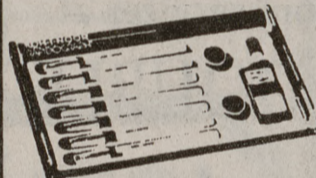
In the afternoon the pope crossed the border back into Italy for a visit to Rimini, a thriving Adriatic beach resort 12 miles from San Marino.

The pope ended his visit to Rimini with an outdoor mass attended by several hundred thousand people near the beach. The crowd was so large it stretched onto the sand almost to the water, where tugboats and yachts blew their whistles to salute the pontiff.
